

23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time-Happy Labor Day!

"Work is fundamental to the dignity of a person. Work, to use an image, 'anoints' us with dignity, fills us with dignity, makes us similar to God, who has worked and still works, who always acts..." - Pope Francis, Feast of St. Joseph the Worker and World Labor Day, 5/1/13

"I address a strong appeal from my heart that the dignity and safety of the worker always be protected." - *Pope Francis, Regina Caeli, 4/28/13*

On this Sunday before Labor Day, we have an opportunity to reflect on what the Church teaches us about the dignity of work and the rights of workers. In the Catholic tradition, work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continued participation in God's creative action. The Catholic bishops of the United States have long held that the most effective way to build a just economy is to make decent work at decent wages available for all those capable of working. When the economy fails to generate sufficient jobs, there is a moral obligation to protect the life and dignity of unemployed and underemployed workers and their families.

In Catholic social teaching, the dignity of work and the rights of workers are important because work is a form of continuing participation in God's creation, and so the basic rights of workers must be respected. Worker Justice Wisconsin is an example of how valuing the dignity of work can play out in 'the real world.' They are a non-profit organization located here in Madison that partners with faith communities. They help workers to advocate for just and living wages, workplaces that are safe and free from discrimination, and opportunities for collective organizing to address workplace issues such as wage theft. The majority of the workers helped are Hispanic, and in 2021 WJW helped to recover \$111,762 in previously owed but unpaid wages. En este domingo que antecede el Día del Trabajo, tenemos la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre lo que la Iglesia nos enseña sobre la dignidad del trabajo y los derechos de los trabajadores. En la tradición católica, el trabajo es más que una forma de ganarse la vida; es una forma de participación continua en la acción creadora de Dios. Los obispos católicos de los Estados Unidos han sostenido durante mucho tiempo que la forma más efectiva de construir una economía justa es hacer que el trabajo decente con salarios decentes esté disponible para todos aquellos capaces de trabajar. Cuando la economía no logra generar suficientes puestos de trabajo, existe la obligación moral de proteger la vida y la dignidad de los trabajadores desempleados y subempleados y sus familias.

En la doctrina social católica, la dignidad del trabajo y los derechos de los trabajadores son importantes porque el trabajo es una forma de participación continua en la creación de Dios, por lo que se deben respetar los derechos básicos de los trabajadores. Worker Justice Wisconsin es un ejemplo de cómo la valoración de la dignidad del trabajo puede funcionar en el "mundo real". Son una organización sin fines de lucro ubicada aquí en Madison que se asocia con comunidades religiosas. Ayudan a los trabajadores a abogar por salarios justos y dignos, lugares de trabajo seguros y libres de discriminación y oportunidades para la organización colectiva para abordar problemas en el lugar de trabajo, como el robo de salarios. La mayoría de los trabajadores que recibieron ayuda son hispanos, y en 2021 WJW ayudó a recuperar \$111,762 en salarios adeudados anteriormente pero no pagados. The Season of Creation is a liturgical season dedicated to prayer, reflection, and celebration of God as Creator. It also celebrates and reflects prayerfully on the gifts of creation and the mission given us by God to care for creation and respond to its needs and crises today. Let us observe this season well and continue to pray and do our part to care for God's creation.

Next week, the St. Thomas Aquinas Music Ministry will return to its "normal" fall rehearsal schedule for the first time since before the pandemic began. There are many opportunities for students and adults to become involved. If you are currently involved as a musician, choir member, or cantor here at St. Thomas Aquinas, THANK YOU! If you are not currently involved in our music ministry, NOW is the time to consider becoming involved!

Cantors/Small Group Singers: (Saturday 4:30p.m./Sunday 8:00a.m./Summer Months—Sunday 10:00 a.m.)

The cantors' and singers' primary function is to support and encourage the congregation in singing. They are our song leaders, animators, and psalmists. These small groups of singers share their gifts and talents year-round. Join any time.

STA Parish Choir: (Sunday 10:00a.m. – Sept–May)

The STA Parish Choir sings weekly at the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. In addition, this group sings for evening Holy Day Masses, Midnight Mass, Christmas Day, Holy Week, Easter, Confirmation, and other special liturgical celebrations during the church year. Open to students (grades 7+) and adults. Rehearsals are Thursdays from 6:30-8:30 p.m. The ability to read music is helpful, but not necessary. – Our first rehearsal is scheduled for **Thursday**, **September 8**. Please contact me ahead of time if you are interested in joining us or would like more information so that things can be prepared for our first rehearsal.

STA Choristers: (Saturday 4:30p.m. &/or Sunday 10:00a.m., Once or Twice a Month – September–May)

The STA Choristers (Children's Choir) sing monthly at the 4:30p.m. Saturday Mass and/or the Sunday 10:00a.m. Mass. In addition, this group has the opportunity to sing for other celebrations, including Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Eve Masses. This choir sings from September through May each year, and is open to students (grades 3-8) as well as high school students. Students should be able to read well in order to keep up at rehearsals and Masses! Rehearsals are most often on Wednesday from 5-6p.m. – Our first rehearsal is scheduled for **Wednesday**, **September 7 at 5:00p.m.** Please share the word and let's get some more of our students involved!

STA Spanish Choir: (Saturday 6:30 p.m.)

The STA Spanish Choir sings weekly at the 6:30 p.m. Saturday Mass. This choir joins the STA Parish Choir for bilingual celebrations throughout the liturgical year. This choir sings year round and is open to students (grades 7+) and adults. Rehearsals are on Saturdays at 5:30 p.m. before the 6:30 p.m. Spanish Mass. Join any time. Instrumentalists & Accompanists: (All Masses)

Instrumentalists and accompanists (piano and/or organ) are encouraged to join our music ministry, depending upon experience. Audition required.

Gospel Reflection

Really Cool Info Attached

Luke 14:25-33

Wow! A tough Gospel today – "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." So we have to hate our Mom and Dad and spouse?

Well, no, not exactly. Then why does Luke seem to have Jesus say so? There are a couple reasons. First, let's look at the word Luke uses here: hate. The Aramaic (the language Jesus spoke) word that corresponds to the Greek word that Luke uses actually has a broader sense than we tend to think when we hear "hate." It could mean anything from actually despising someone to simply loving someone else more. So, Jesus could be saying that we should love being his disciple MORE than loving our Mom & Dad or spouse. In fact, if you look at the parallel reading from the Gospel of Matthew (10:37) here is what Jesus says: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me."

Second, we need to look at the reading in a broader context. In the whole of Jesus teachings, he does not teach hate (except to hate sin!), but love. Then why does Luke use the Greek word for "hate?" Perhaps for the same reason that hearing it in the Gospel today made us all squirm a little. Maybe to jar his readers, and us, into thinking about what discipleship should mean for us. These last few Sundays we have been hearing about the requirements of discipleship. Two weeks ago we heard about the narrow door, last week about the need for humility, and today about the need for self-sacrifice and putting Christ before all else. It is a message we would "hate" to miss.

Maybe that's not **really** what RCIA stands for, but if you are curious, read on . . .

In general:

Do you have questions about faith?

Are you searching for a safe place to discuss issues and questions regarding God and faith?

Are you searching for something that seems to be missing from your life?

Or specifically:

Have you been a Catholic all your life, but never celebrated all the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist)?

Have you joined us from a different faith background & would like to find out more about the Catholic Church?

Have you been worshiping with us, but never officially taken the step to become Catholic?

Have you been away from the Church, and have now returned, but want to know more?

If you or someone you know answers **YES** to any of these questions, you are invited to find out more through a process called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). It is a journey that begins with your questions. There is no obligation to join the church as you discover more about faith and later, more specifically, Catholic faith.

The decision is ultimately yours to discern if this is to be your spiritual home. The invitation is always open. Contact Dcn. Jerome at *dcn.jerome@stamadison.org*.
