



Mission Appeal Weekend, June 24th & 25th

Join Rev. Charles Collins as he preaches about his **Mission Diocese of Jaffna/Sri Lanka**

Our diocese is in the northern part of Sri Lanka and it has Tamil people as predominant race. It has 71 parishes and each having a minimum of six sub-stations, with 140 diocesan priests, 60 religious priests, 250 male and female religious sisters and brothers, and 502 volunteer catechists to serve our people. We also have 52 diocesan major seminarians, 63 minor seminarians preparing themselves to go to the Major Seminary, 68 religious seminarians and 55 religious novices undergoing formation to serve in the diocese and around the world as priests and religious. Besides the National Seminary in Ampitlya for the formation of the major seminarians of all the dioceses in Sri Lanka, we also have our diocesan Major Seminary (St. Francis Xavier's Seminary) for the contextual formation of the Tamil students within our culture and struggles.

The COVID-19 pandemic and the public health crisis that arose thereof did place an enormous economic effects on our diocese. To weather the storm of the pandemic, our diocese had been looking for some assistance from our dioceses or from other countries. However, the pandemic has had a global effect that did not present much opportunities for others to extend a helping hand. Our country has faced a civil war for almost three decades and the war reached a excruciating climax, with ferocious battle in the civilian areas in 2009. According to UN reports, during the final battle alone in May 2009, more than 140,000 people died, many thousands were rendered homeless. While a few thousand peoples' names reached the disappeared list, the war also left many thousands as widows and orphans. Our churches and parish houses were also destroyed and/or damaged.

At present, the country of Sri Lanka, an island nation of 22 million people, is facing a worse economic and political crisis. Driving the discontent is the worst economic downturn since the country gained independence in 1948.

Since the end of the war in 2009, our bishop has been successful in the rebuilding of our diocese after the terrible catastrophe. In this process of reconstruction, the mission appeals we made in the US in the past years have played a major role and we are ever grateful to the Church in the US. Besides our efforts on direct evangelization, this mission of love is providing assistance to the needy and touches also the hearts of the people belonging to other religions.

The money collected through this mission appeal will be utilized for the missionary activities of the diocese and for the needs of the formation of the future clergy and religious.

The Jaffna Diocese truly appreciates the prayers and contributions received and strives to be good stewards of what is received so that it may have the greatest possible positive impact. Our Bishop, Most Rev. Justin B. Gnanapragasam, priests, deacons, religious, and missionaries serving in the Jaffna Diocese/Sri Lanka will remember you in their prayers.

From the Pastor's Desk Father's Day

Today we celebrate Father's Day remembering fathers in a special way. As we know, Pope Francis has placed great emphasis and focus on fatherhood, reminding us that being a father is a great privilege and also a great responsibility. Many of our parishioners are fathers, and they are challenged to set a good example for their children as they grow in wisdom and knowledge.

In one of his weekly addresses, on Father's Day, Pope Francis specifically addressed fathers, saying, "I ask that you have the grace to be very close to your children, letting them grow, but being by their side. They need you, your presence, to be there, your love." He encouraged fathers to look to St. Joseph as their model, indicating that St. Joseph's great mission is to be a guardian. Our Holy Father noted, "Even though God was Jesus' Father, St. Joseph lovingly took on the paternal role and taught the young Jesus various skills, the value of work, reverence for the Lord, and fidelity and obedience to God's will."

Pope Francis indicated that St. Joseph faced hardship, suffering, and trials during his journey of faith. He encouraged the faithful to learn from St. Joseph that "only trust in God can turn doubt into certainty, evil into good, total darkness of the night into a radiant dawn." We are challenged to take these words to heart as we deal with many uncertainties and trials. Our Holy Father also called on us to honor our fathers, noting that our love for our fathers should reflect the love that God has for all of us. One way we can honor our fathers is by assisting in their care in their later years, after the many years they have cared for us in so many different ways.

The following prayer calls upon our Heavenly Father to bless and guide all fathers:

Heavenly Father, you entrusted your Son Jesus, the child of Mary, To the care of Joseph, an earthly father. Bless all fathers as they care for their families. Give them strength and wisdom, tenderness and patience; Support them in the work they have to do, Protect those who look to them, as we look to you for love and salvation, Through Jesus Christ our rock and defender, In union with the Holy Spirit, our God forever and ever. St. Joseph, pray for all our fathers. Amen.

As we reflect on this prayer, we are invited to take time on this day to express our love and appreciation for our fathers and thank them for all that they do for us and for all that they mean to us.
