

The to and from my journey to another "Valley of Mary's Smile", is a constant reminder of the goodness of God and the responsibilities I have to the One who holds my life, my heart, and all of you!

The Length of a Rosary

I have what you might call 'a bucket list' which I wrote 25 years ago. It listed a series of activities to do and various places to visit before I was too old to do so. At the top of my list was the desire to make a silent retreat at a site I could drive to which would support my desire for prayer, silence, and liturgical beauty in both environment and Scriptural content.

Seven years ago, I shared my list with Father Lorenzo Tosco, my best priest friend and major Scripture professor at Saint Mary Seminary. He looked at the list, teased me a bit and then said, "Do the first journey. Go to the Trappist Abbey at Genesee; it has all of what you want. And remember" he added, you have to come back!" "Let's face it, "I replied, "a woman would never be allowed in the Trappist Cloister, and I choose not sleep in the forest!!"

Father Lorenzo went on to explain that Genesee was the site where he took his novices in formation for his and their yearly retreats. "It affords," he said. "simple accommodations, good food, acres of land that support silence and it is only 'the length of a rosary away' from Bethlehem House, where visitors reside". I decided to schedule a retreat at the Abbey in "The Valley of Mary's Smile", and in hindsight, it was the best decision I ever made to enrich my spiritual life!

The Abbey's schedule revolves around prayer and work – prayer being the most important. The Liturgy of the Hours governs the daily schedule, and is built on five 'Hours', approximately 30 minutes in duration, with specific psalms, songs, and Scripture readings for each. I attended four of the five (omitting the 2:15 am Vigils), praying 'the length of a Rosary' to and from the Abbey for a total of eight Rosaries per day. Praying the rosary while traveling became a regular practice that endures today. The Genesee experience taught me once again that God often writes straight with crooked lines, even if God's writing is delayed.

Two years before Covid 19 entered our lives, I attend 7:30 am Mass at Saint Andrew Abbey on the Sundays I held RCIA sessions. One Sunday, I came early and was able to join in chanting Lauds. With the permission of both Abbot Hoover and Brother Peter, the Abbey Prior, I was given permission to join this Benedictine Community for Lauds, followed by daily Mass, and Vespers that are held in the early evening.
