



Pastoral Scene

As I approach my one-year anniversary at St Monica, it is with humility that I thank God for all who have shared their time, treasure, and talents through all our ministries and the Beacon of Hope initiative. May God Bless your families in this New Year, as we come before the Eucharist, seeking His Light and Peace.

The climax of the story of the Magi; they prostrate themselves to Jesus and offer their gifts to him- it is a beautiful icon of the right relationship of science to religion- it not saying that science surrenders to religion, but rather that science offers the very best it has to the author of all things.



One fact overlooked in this science religion debate is that modern physical sciences developed out of a Christian thought world.

No science would ever get off the ground unless science thought the world was intelligible- knowable - marked with form and fundamental structure.

Einstein discerned on how mathematical complexities can be found in all dimensions of the worldthe microscopic, macrocosmic—

The ground for this conviction is the DOCTRINE OF CREATION

The world has been brought into being by God.

Another element overlooked in the debate is that many of the founders of modern science were deeply religious- Paschal, Descartes, Newton

Not superficially - they wrote a lot about religion and its relationship to science. The founder of modern genetics, Mendel, was a priest,

As well as the formulator of the big bang theory in 20th century- Belgian priest- Georges Lemaître, a Belgian priest-astronomer and known as "the father of modern cosmology".

The Catholic Church does not have a section in the Catechism that dictates what methods science should use. What we do, however, as a Church, is acknowledge that the treasure of the sciences – all these findings in physics, medicine, chemistry, astronomy, etc., should be brought to God- who is the source of Truth and Order and the Universe.

This is the right relationship we see in the visit of the Magi as they lay their treasures at the feet of the child Jesus. The Catholic Church has always maintained at its best that WISE MEN OF EVERY AGE ARE DRAWN TO CHRIST

The star that the Magi followed reveal to us that science is revered by religion, and religion is the proper source and goal of all the sciences.

The Cathedral in Cologne, Germany claims to be the final resting place for the Wisemen– the Shrine of the Three Kings. It is not important whether science can prove this or not.

Please reflect on this excerpt from St John Paull II that he shared with teachers and university students in Cologne Cathedral, Saturday, November 15, 1980.

Science and faith in the search for truth

In this cathedral there have been kept and venerated for centuries the bones of the Wise Men, who at the beginning of the new age which dawned with the Incarnation of God, set out to pay homage to the true Lord of the world. These men, in whom the knowledge of their time was summed up, become therefore the model of every man in search of truth. The knowledge which reason attains finds its completion in the adoration of divine truth. The man who sets out towards this truth does not suffer any loss of his freedom: on the contrary, in trusting dedication to the Spirit whom we have been promised through Jesus Christ's redeeming work, he is led to complete freedom and to the fullness of a truly human existence

Entrance Chant 329 We Three Kings

First Reading Isaiah 60:1-6

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you.

See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory.

Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance.

READINGS & SONGS

Second Reading Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

Brothers and sisters: You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation. It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

since from you shall come a ruler,

who is to shepherd my people Israel."


Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.
