

Saint of the Day

ST. LEONIE AVIAT

Founder, Oblate Sisters of St. Francis de Sales (1844 - 1914)

Leonie Aviat, the daughter of French shopkeepers, was educated in the Visitation convent in Troyes. There she experienced the first stirrings of a religious vocation that would only grow over time. Her way became clear to her one day when she took her mother's eyeglasses to be repaired in a factory, and there found herself deeply moved by the condition of the young women workers. In this era of industrialization, many young rural women were drawn by the promise of factory work, only to face homelessness and every kind of exploitation. The chaplain of Leonie's school, Fr. Louis Brisson, had some years earlier established a center in Troyes to house and educate such women. Leonie volunteered to join him in this work and soon became the administrator of the house. With other volunteers, she and Fr. Brisson eventually formed a new congregation, the Oblate Sisters of St. Francis de Sales. Taking their inspiration from "Jesus the Worker," they sought to form young working women into apostles who would spread the spirit of God's love in their workplaces. As she instructed her sisters, "Let us be God's little tools and allow Him to use us according to His wishes." The congregation was approved in 1911, by which time communities had spread to South Africa and Ecuador. Mother Leonie, who served as superior, died on January 10, 1914. She was canonized in 2001.

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, or Theophany, is the feast day commemorating the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. Originally the baptism of Christ was celebrated on Epiphany, which commemorates the coming of the Magi, the baptism of Christ, and the wedding at Cana. Over time in the West, however, the celebration of the baptism of the Lord came to be commemorated as a distinct feast from Epiphany. It is celebrated in the Catholic Church as well as the Anglican and Lutheran Churches on the first Sunday following The Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6)



Stewardship

As we celebrate this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we can study His actions at the Jordan River as a powerful example of servant leadership. We see in Jesus a type of leadership that is characterized by humility and leading by example.

Certainly, the sinless Savior did not need a baptism of repentance! But Jesus humbly made Himself one with his people to draw us to Him and create a relationship with us so that we would be open to His teachings and influence. As a servant leader, we also see that Jesus leads by example. He does not just tell the people they need to be baptized. He shows them how and does it Himself to teach them. To lead like Jesus, we, too, must "walk the walk" and not just "talk the talk." If we want those who we lead to be generous and hard-working, then we must show them how to do this by demonstrating generosity and hard work ourselves.

Immediately after His baptism, we learn of the powerful affirmation of the Father who opens the heavens, sends the Holy Spirit upon Jesus in bodily form, and says audibly, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased." Let us be filled with gratitude for our amazing God and be reminded that when we are grateful followers of Jesus and servant-leaders in imitation of Him, the Father will be well-pleased with us, too.
