## Healing the Whole Person Early Registration is Open Until Sunday, January 30th

Thursday, April 7th & Friday, April 8th from 6:00-9:30 pm, & Saturday, April 9th from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm in the Church

Do you want to be well? In The Chosen series, Jesus asks the man at the Pool of Bethesda, "Do you want to be healed?" While these questions seem interchangeable, to be well depicts more of a restoration of wholeness, of healing on more than just a physical level. And while the Divine Physician can heal me, to be well requires a conscious choice and active participation on my part.

My journey of healing began in 2018 when I attended my first *Healing the Whole Person* retreat. I registered thinking I would gain some tools for my Physical Therapy toolbox. It's a healing profession after all. I soon realized after the first talk, that I was the one who needed healing. It was quite intriguing, enlightening, agitating, and liberating, all at the same time. I was brought to a place of realization that my patterns of behavior and sin are tied to wounds from my past, some of which had been buried behind walls for years.

When I attended my second Healing the Whole Person retreat in 2020, my heart knew that the journey toward healing is never really over. It will likely last a lifetime. But I now have a new vocabulary and a roadmap on how to look inward and recognize what agitates me – to pause, self-reflect, ask for healing, and grow toward wholeness, which is precisely where God wants me to be.

Believing that "wounded people wound people" inspires a spirit of deeper compassion for myself and others, for we are all broken. There is such profound peace and comfort in not just knowing that I'm loved but truly feeling God's love as he heals my wounds. Only love heals. And so, in my prayerful encounters with Jesus, I respond, "Yes, I do want to be well. Show me how."

All registrants will receive a link to the Livestream for no additional cost. If you choose to Livestream only, the cost is \$119.
