

### From the Earth Ministry: Eco-Friendly Deicing



Winter in Wisconsin means snow and ice. We try to keep our driveways and walkways clear to avoid slips and falls. However, salt can damage concrete and is harmful to the environment. The chloride that is contained in rock salt can wash into lakes and streams



and even seep into our water table. The concentration can build over the winter and reach levels harmful to plankton and fish. Salt can be harmful to pets by irritating their paws or making them sick if they ingest it by licking their paws. Salt spray can also harm plants and shrubs by causing them to lose their cold hardiness. Many municipalities are reducing their use of salt by diluting the brine with organic things such as beet juice, beer waste and pickle brine.

Here are some eco-friendly things you can do at home:

**Shoveling** - The best deterrent to ice is to shovel as soon after a snowfall as possible to allow the sunshine to dry out surfaces and avoid ice build-up.

Organic Salt-free Deicers – These can be found at Outpost, hardware or big box stores and do not contain rock salt. They are a bit pricier but do the job safely.

**Sand or Kitty Litter** – Provide traction and for sand, a great way to use up excess from a sandbox.

Wood By-products – Wood shavings and sawdust from your workshop provide traction. So does ash from last night's fire. Ash also darkens the snow, attracting heat from the sun for melting.

**Coffee Grounds** – Sprinkling used grounds will help speed melting and provide some traction. This does not work very quickly so it is best done when temperatures aren't too low and the sun is shining.




### Catechesis Corner

## Travel for the Beatification of Fr. Rutilio Grande

You are invited to join a delegation to El Salvador from January 18-24, 2022. The occasion is the celebration of the beatification of Father Rutilio Grande García. Fr. Grande was a Jesuit priest who took the lessons of Vatican II to heart and changed the Catholic Church in El Salvador. He was assassinated in 1977, with two other Salvadorans. His life and work were a major influence for St. Oscar Romero.

The delegation will be led by SHARE - El Salvador. It will include the beatification ceremony of Fr. Rutilio Grande, the Route of the Martyrs, and the tomb of St. Romero. Participants will learn about the current human rights situation in El Salvador. There will be side trips to communities in the countryside. The cost is approximately \$650, and includes transportation within El Salvador, food, guest house, translation and organization of the visit. Airfare is additional. ### Year End Giving & Contribution Statements

Year End Contribution Statements will be generated in early January. The statements will include contributions from all sources, including WeShare. However, only weekly envelopes, stock contributions, and maintenance donations are included. Advent Giving, Mission Contributions, and Sharing Sunday are pass through; that is, the donation goes to the recipient charity, not St. Therese.

If your address has changed, please let our Interim Bookkeeper Christine know. The information can be updated prior to mailing the statements.

If you plan to donate stock to St. Therese by December 31st, please contact our Interim Bookkeeper Christine for our brokerage information. Please also note, per the Archdiocese, that the CARES Act allows for a \$300 charitable deduction in 2021 (\$600 if married and filing a joint return) if you take the standard deduction. Please check with your tax advisor for more information.

#### **Hospital Visits**


