



Earth Stewardship Ministry: Introduction to PFAS

This is the first in a series of articles on PFAS. As we learn more about the health risks of these "forever chemicals," we will hear of them more frequently. The Earth Ministry team wants to prepare you to understand PFAS. The letters stand for Per- and Poly-Fluoro Alkyl Substances. Some of these manufactured chemicals have been used since the 1940's.



They are found in and associated with the making of firefighting foam, Teflon, and liquid repellents like Scotchguard, Stainmaster and Gore-Tex. They are not currently regulated by the federal government or the state of Wisconsin.


We are now realizing that they can cause serious health problems, such as decreased fertility, high blood pressure, developmental delays, cancers (prostate, kidney, and testicular), reduced ability to fight infections, interference with the body's natural hormones, increased cholesterol, and increased risk of obesity. The PFAS can be found in water, soil, air, food, and many materials found in homes and workplaces. They breakdown very, very slowly and so they have been building up in people, animals and the environment since the 1940's.



A Stewardship Moment

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time – January 15th/16th

In today's second reading, Saint Paul makes a list of gifts dispensed to members of the Christian community by the Holy Spirit. Each gift bestowed has a specific purpose for the person for whom it is intended: wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, mighty deeds, prophecy, discernment, tongues, and interpretation. Good stewards know these gifts are not meant to be kept hidden by the recipient but to be shared with the community and beyond. As we begin a new year, let us reflect on the gift the Holy Spirit has given to each of us. Do we recognize this gift? How was it intended that we use this gift? Are we being good stewards of this gift?

St. Sebastian | January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 - 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes. ©LPi

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – January 18-25

"We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship Him." - Matthew 2:2



The theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2022 was selected by the Middle East Council of Churches and originates from the churches in Lebanon. The theme expresses the Eastern Churches' tradition of joining Epiphany to the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, a baptism all Christians hold in common as testimony to their faith in the Son of God. Present times in Lebanon are extremely difficult and economically disastrous. All this combined with the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have made the situation quite stressful. The power of prayer in solidarity with those who suffer is a demonstration of Christian unity and a sign of communion. *(from the website of the Graymoor Ecumenical and Interreligious Institute)*

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. In preparation for the WPCU, ecumenical partners in a particular region were asked to prepare a basic text on a biblical theme. By annually observing the WPCU, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (cf. John 17:21)


