Blessings to you my friends of St. Thomas and St. Clare, as we begin this New Year, we can reflect upon the gifts of Christmas that we gave or received, and the specialness of each gift. We can also reflect upon the most precious gift of Love that we receive from God, the gift of His Son in our lives. I now would like you to reflect and contemplate on the opportunity to give the gift of a part of yourself, to help extend the life of someone in our faith community. There are approximately 93,000 people awaiting a kidney transplant. I can't tell you all their stories, but; I can tell you ours. My wife Resa was born with Cystic Fibrosis, the life expectancy was 16 years of age for those with CF in 1971. I met her at 22 years of age and fell in love with her instantly, and am deeply in love to this day. In that love we left our fate in the hands of God. My wife was blessed with a double lung transplant in 2006, and by the Grace of God, Resa has done incredibly well with all the challenges associated with a transplant, minus the fact that it killed her kidneys, hence this plea; I would like you to consider donating a kidney. We don't often get the opportunity to be part of a Miracle, but; by being a living organ donor your gift of a kidney would be a blessing, and enable you to be part of giving extended life to someone in need. So I am asking you at this time to prayerfully consider giving the gift of a part of yourself in donating an organ. I also ask that if you can't, please pray that we will find a donor and Resa will receive the gift of another life saving organ transplant. Each year we do Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter "food baskets" (gift card) to our pantry clients, as well as some local assistance to a few school families in need. Besides food baskets, we do presents to the children at Christmas (gift cards). This is in addition to the help we provide twice monthly during our 2 hour open sessions, on the 2nd and 4th Friday. For Thanksgiving 2021 we helped 50 pantry families with a

Pick N Save food card. We helped 16 school families also.
For Christmas 2021 we helped 55 pantry families and 9 school families with a Pick N Save food card.
We provided "presents" to 85 children from our pantry family. We also helped 22 school children.
I want to thank the parish for the very generous support of the Food Pantry. It is really great that we get the support from our parish family that allows us to do this.
