LEGACY CAMPAIGN



Legacy Update

I'm overdue for an update on our Legacy Campaign. As it stands now, we have raised \$534,942 with our Legacy Campaign. 435 of you, our parishioners, have contributed and we thank them.

Phase 1 of the Campaign was our Life Safety update at our St. Bernadette Center. \$83,000 was contributed to this phase by parish members and a CDBG grant was secured for the balance of the costs.

Phase 2 was the Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning for the second floor of the St. Bernadette Center. 100% of the costs were contributed by community organizations, a few interested parishioners and grants written and awarded.

I can't thank enough Jerry and Julie Lopas for writing the grants and Jody Lueck for her amazing leadership in approaching outside donors/corporations.

As of November, the Legacy Campaign had a balance of \$323,924 that was to be used for the Parking Lot. An additional \$211,018 has been contributed by 130 parishioners since November for a total of \$534,972.

Depending on how one looks at that, it's good news or bad news.

I've been able to have a conversation with a few of you this past week. I learned of some concerns and received some suggestions too. I'd like to share some of this now.

One concern was how this campaign seemed to come out of nowhere. This is part of the Legacy Campaign that began in January 2017 with three-year commitments by many of you through last March 2020. Due to COVID – we put a pause on additional fundraising. However, our Building and Grounds Committee and our Councils have continued to work on what many of you had deemed through our 2016 Parish Survey our #1 priority – a new parking lot. Many hours have been spent discussing options and visiting sites of various parking lot projects.


So finally, we were positioned to tackle the big project. When we kicked off Phase 3 in early November we had already raised \$323,924. This was money that had come in over the past three years from Legacy Campaign pledges. We decided it was best to make a push now so that we could get this project done this summer before inflation drives the price up.

Another concern that was voiced was the price tag. The \$1,000,000 price tag is the complete reconstruction of 3 parking lots. Let me break that out a bit. Because this is a COMPLETE reconstruction, the new parking lots must comply with the City of Appleton's current ordinances. The storm water management plan may cost as much as \$60,000. This is one example of a City of Appleton ordinance of which there are many such as the number of parking spots based upon the usage of our buildings. The conduit, wiring and controls for the parking lot lights is estimated to cost \$40,000. What is currently installed in the parking lot is obsolete. The total reconstruction of the 3 PARKING LOTS on our campus will require over 2,730 tons of asphalt which equates to 100 truckloads. The cost of engineering the project and contingencies for unforeseen costs is \$195,000.

Currently we are working with McMahan and Associates to put together the final design documents as well as working with the city of Appleton to receive all the necessary approvals to proceed. We will then put the project out to bid. Bidding early in the construction season achieves best price available. We are looking to be completed the by the end of March in order to present to the Diocese for Proxy/approval April 14th.

I know that the average gift of \$1,500 that I asked for is a big sacrifice. I know that this is not the best time to attempt to raise the rest of the money. A concern some of the leadership has however is that if we don't want to allow the money we had to be wasted through inflation and price increases, we thought it best to press ahead. One of the major components of blacktop is oil. As the price of petroleum increases so does the price of blacktop and therefore the parking lot.

One way or another we will do something with the parking lot, but I really would love to see 100% participation. If everyone could give at least something to show our solidarity with St. Bernadette's and those who have already contributed, I would greatly appreciate it.



A Simple Explanation of THE MASS by Fr. Eamon Tobin

There are 4 Parts of the Mass

- I. Introductory Rites
- II. Liturgy of the Word
- III. Liturgy of the Eucharist
- IV. Concluding Rites

This week we will talk about the Introductory Rites. The Introductory Rites of the Mass consist of:

- **Entrance Procession and Song**
 - The Mass begins when the Cantor invites the assembly to rise and join in the singing of the Entrance Song.
 - Purpose is to unify those gathered into a community so that together they can offer true worship to the Father.
 - Then those involved in the Processes reaches the sanctuary area of the Church, they bow before the altar as a gesture of respect.
 - The deacon places the Book of the Gospels on the altar, which emphasizes the interconnection between the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.
 - The presider and the deacon venerate the altar with a kiss. The Altar-Table symbolizes Christ. The kissing of the altar at the beginning of Mass is an act of greeting to Christ through whom our worship ascends to the Father.
 - The processional cross is placed in the sanctuary near the altar to remind us of the intimate connection between the Mass and Calvary.
- **Sign of the Cross and Greeting**
 - When Entrance Song ends, the presider and assembly join together in making the Sign of the Cross. Here we proclaim that we belong to Christ and that he is our way to the Father.
- **Penitential Act**
 - This is a reminder that we are a community always in need of inner renewal and always in need of God's mercy.
- **Gloria**
 - Praise to God to prepare our hearts and minds to fully and worthily celebrate the holy mysteries.
- **Collect**
 - In this prayer, the presider with outstretched arms collects, as it were, the prayers of the assembly and presents them to God through Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Collect completes the Introductory Rites of the Mass



