FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

2022. It's hard to believe, but we are nearly through the first month of a new year. This is my third at St. Bernadette's. I'm very grateful. I'm grateful for our dedicated staff. They go above and beyond in so many ways. Also, it looks like we have finally found the right man to be our Maintenance Technician. Soon you will hear more about Dan. I'm also grateful for our dedicated volunteers. We have a crew that so often goes above and beyond. In addition to your generosity in time and talent, I'm grateful for your incredible financial generosity. We are doing well. A highlight of this past year was the successful completion of the Legacy Campaign and the installation of our new parking lot. It couldn't have been done without so many of you going above and beyond during the third and final phase.

I do have one thing that weighs on my heart. Our Mass attendance has yet to recover from our closure back in 2020. We were moving in the right direction. We were back to around two thirds of our previous attendance. It seems now however that we have pulled back again. During this entire time, I've noticed it is our younger families especially who have been missed. One of the sad things that happened over the past two years was the unfortunate distinction being made between "essential" and "non essential" services. There is nothing unessential about in person worship. I'm concerned about the long term effects of so many, especially our younger families, not hearing the Word of God nor receiving the Sacraments regularly. The spiritual impact will also have an impact on the rest of our lives, our culture and economic strength in the coming years. It is all integrated.

During the difficult times under King Henry VIII, attending Catholic Mass was outlawed. People were even put to death if they were caught at Mass. People kept holy the Lord's Day nonetheless. Still, from the last statistics I found, there are now more practicing Catholics than Anglicans in England. The ancient faith survived, and continues to keep the Spirit of Light in England.

Let's pray for this kind of conviction to take hold of every parishioner here at St. Bernadette's and beyond: a true hunger for worship and the reception of the Sacraments. In person Worship is essential. Each of us have unique circumstances, I understand. But let us truly discern what God is asking of us. Please pray that more and more will truly hunger to celebrate our Faith weekly. More is at stake than we realize. We are a people of hope! In that spirit, each in our own way, let us continue to call people back to the Celebration of Life that gives joy and strength to the heart, to offering praise and worship through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

If you are unable to come forward to receive the Eucharist, a Eucharistic Minister will come to bring Holy Communion to you at the start of the distribution of the Eucharist. Please either stand or raise your hand to indicate that you want to receive the Eucharist. We ask that you sit either in the church at the back to the left of the Baptismal font or in the chapel to facilitate easier distribution.

Beginning Thursday, February 10, St. Patrick's Parish of Menasha will have a Healing Mass every second Thursday of the month at 12 noon.




