





Learn Your Faith

We often think of St. Peter's Basilica as the cathedral of the pope. Although it is the resting place of the Apostle Peter, it is not the cathedral of the pope. That would be the Archbasilica of Christ the Savior or by its more traditional name, St. John Lateran Basilica. This church was dedicated to both St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist and is the oldest legal Christian Church in the world. It was given to the pope in the early 4th century by the Roman Emperor Constantine. It is considered the mother of all the churches in the city of Rome and the whole world. Its full name is **The Sacrosanct Papal Cathedral Greater Roman Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran, the Mother and Head of all the Churches of the City and the World.**

The church was residence to the pope until 1309 when the papacy was forced to move to Avignon, France. When the papacy returned to Rome 70 years later, the facility was in such disarray that the residency was moved. The basilica was rebuilt and remained the primary church of the Roman pontiff.

November 9 is "The Feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran Basilica." The church represents religious freedom. Constantine was the first Christian emperor and he established legal recognition and public security for the first time in the Roman empire. The feast day is a reminder of our Catholic heritage and a reminder of the courage of early Christians who suffered to keep the church united. The pope is the universal pastor and the Lateran Basilica represents our universal church.

St. Peter's Basilica is the more commonly known church today. This is the second St. Peter's and it was built from 1506 to 1626. It took seven architects and 20 popes to complete it. It is widely renowned because it was built during the Renaissance and includes works by artistic masters such as Michelangelo and Raphael. It is the largest church in the world at 15,000 square feet and 85% of the church's façade came from the Colosseum.

There are also two other major basilicas in Rome: St. Paul Outside the Walls, was built by Constantine in the 4th century and is on top of St. Paul's burial place, and Papal Basilica of St. Mary Major, the largest Marian church in Rome which was built in the years 432-440. The Archpriest of St. Paul Outside the Walls is Cardinal James Harvey, a Milwaukee native who was ordained in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

If you have an interest in learning more about these basilicas and their history, a Google search will yield many results, as will a visit to your local library.

Adoration reflection

When I was younger my mom used to drag me to Adoration every now and then. It was nice and all, but as I teenager I felt pretty neutral about the whole thing. Once I moved away from home, I started to appreciate it more. I looked forward to exposition on Holy Thursday and such, but I never really sought out Eucharistic Adoration beyond that.

Fast forward to 2011. My best friend from college and I were both Army Lieutenants. She had moved to North Carolina and had decided to pursue a special all-female combat support team assignment. I was serving as a nurse in Germany.

October 22, 2011 was the worst day of my life. My friend, Ashley, had deployed to Afghanistan. While on a dismounted patrol with a team of Army Rangers, one of them set off a daisy chain of improvised explosive devices. Ashley and two Rangers were killed in the blasts. Those words: Ashley White-Stumpf, KIA still wrench my heart with explosive violence.

The days and months that followed were full of complicated grief. I tried to hold things together wherever I went, but there was one place that always broke me down and that was during Mass, during the Consecration. It was like Jesus himself was looking at me with the saddest eyes asking me to bring my grief to him. I avoided for...well for a loooooong time...

Until one day I found myself chaperoning a Life Teen retreat and found myself in adoration for a full hour. For once, I could no longer escape that sad gaze. It broke me open. It was pure understanding and love like I can't describe. I knew He knew what it felt like to lose a friend He loved. John 11:35 tells us plain and simple after Lazarus died: "Jesus wept." In His presence I wept and I also found strength.

Now, a decade later I seek Him out in Adoration. This past year, through all the sorrows and hardships, I returned again to rest at the foot of the Lord. Perpetual adoration has been the greatest gift to me. He taught me how to be courageous in the face of deep heartache all those years ago and teaches me still.

Stations of the Cross - South Church

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 7 p.m. every Friday during Lent at the South Church. The Stations are a Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. At each station, the participants recall and meditate on a specific event from Christ's last day.

Fasting and Abstinence

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence - meaning that meat is not to be consumed. Abstinence from meat is binding from age 14 onwards.

While fasting is only obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Fr. Patrick encourages those who are able to consider fasting for each of the Fridays in Lent.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Pope Francis's Lenten message

Pope Francis has encouraged Catholics to practice charity in Lent this year by caring for those affected by the coronavirus pandemic. In his message for Lent 2021, the pope asks people to "experience Lent with love," which "rejoices in seeing others grow."

"To experience Lent with love means caring for those who suffer or feel abandoned and fearful because of the COVID-19 pandemic. In these days of deep uncertainty about the future, let us keep in mind the Lord's word to his Servant, 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you' (Isaiah 43:1). In our charity, may we speak words of reassurance and help others to realize that God loves them as sons and daughters," Pope Francis wrote in the message published Feb. 12.

The pope emphasized that even a small amount of almsgiving when offered with "joy and simplicity" can multiply, as did "the loaves blessed, broken and given by Jesus to the disciples to distribute to the crowd."

"Love is a gift that gives meaning to our lives. It enables us to view those in need as members of our own family, as friends, brothers or sisters. A small amount, if given with love, never ends, but becomes a source of life and happiness," he said.

The pope's Lenten message centers on the three theological virtues of faith, hope, and love ... Pope Francis said that the theological virtue of hope is particularly important as the world continues to grapple with the effects of the pandemic.

"In these times of trouble, when everything seems fragile and uncertain, it may appear challenging to speak of hope. Yet Lent is precisely the season of hope, when we turn back to God who patiently continues to care for his creation which we have often mistreated," he said.

"St. Paul urges us to place our hope in reconciliation: 'Be reconciled to God' (2 Corinthians 5:20). By receiving forgiveness in the sacrament that lies at the heart of our process of conversion, we in turn can spread forgiveness to others."

The pope said that one can give hope to others by being kind, sharing the "gift of a smile" or speaking a word of encouragement.

"In Lent, may we be increasingly concerned with speaking words of comfort, strength, consolation and encouragement, and not words that demean, sadden, anger or show scorn," he said.

A special Lenten opportunity

All are welcome to join our parish youth for XLT (short for exalt) on Sunday, Feb. 28 at 7 p.m. Let a brief message and beautiful music touch your heart, pray before our Lord in adoration, and receive the sacrament of reconciliation by visiting one of the several priests joining us to hear confessions. This is a beautiful way to experience God's grace during the Lenten season as we prepare for Christ's death and resurrection!



Lenten Missions


