Learn Your Faith

In Latin, the word "pope" (from Greek "Pappas") means "father." In the early Church, the word "pope" referred to bishops or patriarchs. Later the use of the term became restricted to referencing the bishop of Rome. We know Peter as the first bishop of Rome. Catholics hold that there is an apostolic succession from Christ to the Apostles and then handed down through the Popes and bishops to present day.

There are five distinct time periods in papal history. The first is the early papacy which ran until 590 AD. The second period is the medieval period from 590-1303 AD, followed by the Renaissance and Reformation period from 1303 until 1565. Next was the early modern papacy from 1565 through 1774. Currently, we are in the period of the modern papacy which started in 1774.

Taking a look at early papal history: Peter was replaced by St. Linus, who is the Linus referred to in 2 Timothy 4:21 and who travelled with Paul. He was followed by St. Anacletus or Cletus who was a Roman. Both Linus and Cletus are buried near Peter in St. Peter's Basilica. Many writers included information about papal history, including Irenaeus, a Greek bishop; Hegesippus, a Nazarene who was a Jewish convert and whose writings cover the period to about 180; and St. Eusebius who recorded early church history that had been passed down by word of mouth.

Of the first 50 popes, 48 have become saints and a majority of them were martyrs due to Roman persecution of the early church. When learning about papal history it is important to remember that Christ founded the church with 12 sinners and, though there are many great popes, there are also some misguided popes.

There are many ways to learn about different popes. You could study them by the five time periods. You could read about those popes who are listed as "Great," such as Pope Leo I, Pope Gregory I, Pope Nicholas I, and now many are considering John Paul II in this category.

You can also study based on their influence on history and culture. Among those would be: Pope Sixtus IV who is considered the builder pope due to his redevelopment of Rome; Pope Urban VIII, known as the bee pope because his family's coat of arms had three bees, and who had a significant impact on the arts; and Pope Sixtus V, called the happy pope and who is known for rooting out corruption and lawlessness in Roman society.

If the less devout popes pique your interest, then you might choose to read about Pope Stephen VI who held the Cadaver Synod; Pope John XII whose vanity and infidelity caused political issues and eventually lead to his death; Pope Benedict IX who tried selling the papacy; and Pope Alexander VI, a Borgia whose family name became famous for corruption.

You could also focus on modern day popes like Pope Pius IX, Pope Pius XII, Pope John XXIII and Pope Paul VI. Whichever way you choose to study them, you will learn more about how the Church was formed, how the Church influenced history and how it continues to function today.



Good Shepherd Sunday

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, we hear that Jesus is the Good Shepherd and we are His sheep. In Jesus' time, a shepherd was someone who protected and guided his sheep. Jesus does this for us and so much more. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. This message calls us to reflect inward - do we allow Jesus to shepherd our lives?

In our Gospel Jesus reveals His radical love for us. He says, "A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep... I am the good shepherd... and I will lay down my life for the sheep." Jesus tells us that we are His. We can compare this relationship to that of a loving parent to their child. The parent does not receive payment for nurturing and guiding their child. They constantly give without much in return. And if any evil came near the child, the parent would do anything, even lay down their life for the baby that is their own.



We are Christ's, even more than a child is to a parent. He created us, brought us forth into the world, and sustains our lives each day. Evil persists in our world so Jesus willingly laid down His life for us at Calvary so that we might be saved. He is our Shepherd, whether we remain in His flock or go astray. Whether we accept His care, protection, and guidance or not, He is our Good Shepherd.

But just as a baby is happiest in the arms of a parent, so too are we happiest in the flock of our Shepherd. And just as sheep go astray or try to test their boundaries, we also stray from God, test our limits and even follow false shepherds. Let us look inward and examine our hearts for the times we might have stopped faithfully praying or coming to Mass each week or let money, status, or anything else rule our lives.

Thankfully our Shepherd is a Good Shepherd, and He laid down His life for us knowing every sin we will ever commit. Therefore, let us examine our hearts and return to our flock. We don't even need to find the way. He is right there always waiting to guide us home.


As Peter states in our first reading, "There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved." Jesus is our true Shepherd. There is no other way to happiness or salvation than to remain in His flock. At times it will be challenging to do so. Complacency and sin are enticing, yet every moment we choose Him or return to Him, we will experience peace and freedom that no false independence will suffice. It is through dependence on our Shepherd that we will become liberated.

Let us look inward this week and ask ourselves, 'Who is my Shepherd?' and 'Have I gone astray?' Name the areas in your life that you have neglected and ask Jesus to bring you home. Pray for His mercy, seek His forgiveness in the sacraments and begin again. Remember that we are His and He is ready for us to come home, as He says, "I know mine, and mine know me."




