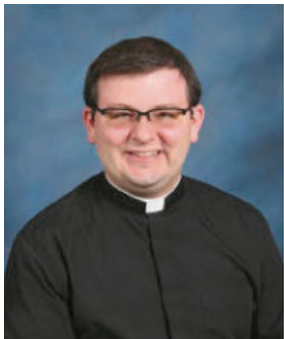

A word from Fr. Matthew Ferch



Next Sunday, we will begin the holy season of Advent. It is the beginning of the new liturgical year! In Advent, we await in joyful anticipation of the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We stand watch and in vigil for the birth of the Messiah—the savior of the world. On the flip side, we use Advent as a reminder that Jesus will come a second time. He will come again to inaugurate the end of this world, so the New Jerusalem can be formed. Jesus tells us that we do not know the day or the hour when he will come, so we need to be awake and be ready for that day (Mt. 25:13). This is why we need to always be on watch against sin, continually repent, and come back to God. This is why we wear violet and do not sing the Gloria during these days of waiting. We are encouraged to turn away from sin and toward God who will be coming again.

Each of the candles on our Advent wreath mean a certain virtue. The first violet candle symbolizes hope. We express our sure and certain hope that there is something after this life, and we pray that God will have mercy on us to let us in to share eternal life with him. The second violet candle symbolizes faith. We express our belief that God is indeed present with us and is working in the world. While we cannot see him in all his glory, we see him working in every aspect of our lives. He has revealed himself to us in the person of Jesus Christ, and he calls us to have faith in him. The third candle, rose, symbolizes joy. We are to be a people of joy because we have been redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ. No longer are we separated from God, but we are able to be close and near to him. Finally, the last violet candle symbolizes peace. We are a people who are to work for God's peace here on Earth. When the reign of God comes fully here on Earth, peace will prevail. So, we need to start working on peace now!

A blessed Advent to all of you! May you use this time in eager waiting for the birth of our Savior well with prayer, conversion, and anticipation for the good work Jesus wants to do through you!

All are welcome to attend Thanksgiving Mass on **Thurs., Nov. 24 at 8:30 a.m. at the North Church.** This is a wonderful opportunity to attend Mass in gratitude for God's generous gifts. Daily Mass at 7 a.m. will be cancelled, along with Confessions at 11 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. The parish office will be opened Mon., Nov. 21- Wed., Nov. 23. Please note, the office will be closed **Thurs., Nov. 24 and Fri., Nov. 25.**

Year End Financial Information

As the end of 2022 approaches, here are a few things you should be aware of regarding your St. Francis Borgia charitable donations. These guidelines correspond to IRS regulations which stipulate that there is no donor "election" as to which calendar year the donation applies. Donations must actually be 'paid' before the close of the tax year to be deductible in that tax year. This includes:

- **In person payments-** we would like to accommodate all our parishioners while respecting the holiday work hours of our office staff so we ask that you please plan ahead to ensure that all in person checks are brought to the office before the office closes at 4:30 PM on Friday, 12/30/22. If you miss that deadline but want to make a 2022 donation please consider our easy to use online giving tool located on our parish website: <https://abundant.co/sfbgiving/give>
- **US Mail-** donations postmarked December 31st or earlier, but received in January 2023, will be credited to the date on the check. Therefore, if the envelope is postmarked 2022 and the check is dated for 2023, the contribution will be credited to your account for 2023; however, if the contribution is postmarked 2022, and received in 2022, the check will be credited to your 2022 donations even if the check date is dated 2023.
- **Stock Transfer-** in the case of stock transfers, the donation date is the date you (the donor) relinquish control of the stock, not the date that St. Francis Borgia (the organization) receives it.
- **Online Donations-** the easiest way to ensure your donation is credited to the tax year you want is by making an online donation. All online donations completed by midnight on 12/31/22, will be considered a 2022 donation. Online donations can be made through this link on our St. Francis Borgia Parish website giving tool: <https://abundant.co/sfbgiving/give>

If you are planning a donation that you wish to be credited for 2022, the sooner you can accomplish this, the better. Please note that the last week of the calendar year our parish office will be closed Mon. 12/26/22, and open Tues.-Fri., from 8:30 a.m. -4:30 p.m. Year-end contribution statements reflecting your 2022 donation will be sent no later than 1/31/23. Should you have any questions about your donations, please contact Jennifer at the parish office at 262-377-1070. We greatly appreciate your generosity and wish you a blessed holiday season.
