


Updates at St. Francis Borgia

A word from Fr. Matthew Ferch



This week, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2. In accord with the Jewish custom, Jesus was presented in the Temple as an offering to God forty days after his birth. As the first-born son, Jesus belongs to the Lord. We hear the prophecies of Simeon and Anna who were immediately able to recognize him as the Messiah. This further shows that this child is to be something great—the savior of Israel and the world. Simeon's prophecy foretells that this child is the fulfillment of the long-awaited promise of the Messiah, and he will be the savior, the light to all the nations. Simeon also predicts Mary's fate as the sorrowful mother. Seven swords will pierce her heart because of the hurt that others have done to her Son.

This day is traditionally referred to as Candlemas. Typically, we bless the candles that will be used for the upcoming year. This is a reminder that Christ is the light of the nations. Christ brings light. He calls us to be light—especially since we received the light of Christ at our Baptism. We need to shine in the midst of the darkness of the world. We need to shine with the light of hope that there can be a better tomorrow—a tomorrow where all will follow the Lord and live in accord with his command to love one another. Let us be that light because the light of Christ never dies out. Let us ask the Lord to make us intense in our fire of love for him and to make him known to others.



- Urgent Needed Items: Blankets of any size, sleeping bags, men and women's winter coats size XL-5X, gloves for men and women, hand warmers, ski masks, long underwear
- Men & Women:
 - Deodorant, toothpaste, shampoo and conditioner, lotion, razors, lip balm, sunscreen, nail clippers, Vaseline, body wash, Kleenex, Vaporub cough drops
 - Men's size L-XL boxers and socks, men's jeans waist size 32-36, Men's T-shirts size XL-2XL, Men's hoodies size 2X-4X
