

## KENOSHA CATHOLIC SCHOOLS ALLIANCE

In response to Archbishop Jerome ListECKI's vision for increased formal collaboration among Catholic schools, we are taking exciting new steps to strengthen Catholic education in Kenosha by encouraging stronger collaboration between All Saints Catholic School and St Joseph Catholic Academy.

The **Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance (KCSA)**, a strategic collaboration between Kenosha's archdiocesan Catholic schools, has been formed to shepherd this effort. Members of the community will be invited to serve on visioning core committees for the project.

**Goals of the Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance.** This KCSA taskforce, representing Kenosha clergy, school board members, administrators, faculty, parents, parish representatives, and key Catholic community leaders, will be charged with uncovering opportunities to further the excellence of a city-wide Catholic school network in Kenosha:

- Strengthen individual identities of All Saints Catholic School and St Joseph Catholic Academy
- Create stronger pathways throughout the Pre-K - 12 network
- Enhance the operational and financial excellence of each school
- Identify opportunities to tap population growth and other possibilities (e.g., new locations, school models)

Bring a stronger Catholic identity and Catholic witness to Kenosha

**Independence of our Kenosha Catholic Schools.** All Saints Catholic School and St Joseph Catholic Academy each remain separate schools within the new Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance. KCSA simply seeks to formalize the cooperation the two schools have always informally maintained and provides new opportunities to build on the schools' Catholic mission and to better serve the Catholic community in Kenosha.

For instance, the new alliance might result in cost-saving measures by encouraging economies of scale in purchasing supplies and equipment. Schools may also be able to create new academic and extra-curricular programming, as well as new teacher professional development opportunities. Schools may unite parishes and the Catholic community of Kenosha to support the schools, as well as enhancing the opportunities for support from grants.

**The initial KCSA Steering Committee.** This committee, led by Very Reverend James Lobacz, Vicar General, and Mr. Bruce Varick, Associate Superintendent of Schools, includes members of the All Saints Catholic School and St Joseph Catholic Academy School Boards, Kenosha Clergy, and School Community members, has met to establish guiding principles for the project. Additionally, we have begun to surface a preliminary list of community representatives for consideration to serve on needed future committees. **Guiding Principles.** Guiding principles are a series of statements used to articulate critical organization values and belief. Decisions made should consistently reflect these principles.

Together we will honor and build upon the unique history, identity, and culture of each parish and each of the two schools.

Together we will participate in creating support for a Pre-K – 12 Catholic education network in Kenosha that provides an option for families who desire formal education that engenders Catholic teachings and the Catholic worldview.

Together we will plan and implement this network according to the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools striving for academic excellence and committed to the holistic development of every student.

Together we will create an overall governance structure that openly and justly engages with all constituencies, modeling stewardship of all resources.

Together we will strive to grow the network and increase the capacity of our schools to meet student, family, and community needs.

**Next steps.** The KCSA plan calls for the Core Committees of Finance, Governance and Mission, and Communications, to be established and conduct working meetings beginning in January 2021. Early in the New Year community feedback on Catholic education will be obtained through surveys, focus groups, town hall meetings and similar pathways. The goal is to complete all necessary research and decision making to produce a proposal by May 15, 2021. This is the first of regular updates that will be produced by the Steering Committee.

## GOOD NEWS

For those of us who grew up during the “radio-age,” listening to our favorite radio programs was as important as watching our favorite TV programs today. My parents listened to the news every evening on the huge cabinet-sized radio that sat in our living room, and I can remember the newsman beginning his nightly newscast with the words: “Good evening, there’s good news tonight!” Even during World War II when much of the news was bleak, he always found some positive news to include in his nightly report.

So it is with the gospel we hear proclaimed each weekend. The word gospel means ‘good news.’ Each time we hear the gospel story, we are hearing good news no matter what the content of the story may be. It is a reminder of those radio newscasts heard so long ago telling us that there is always good news to be proclaimed. All who preach the gospel by their words and works remind us that God’s Word is always good news, yesterday, today, tomorrow and forever!

From Pope John Paul II we hear: ***“The strength to see the good side of things should be characteristic of the Christian. If the Gospel really means ‘good news,’ then being a Christian means being a happy person...one who spreads joy.”*** Our Gospel for this second Sunday of Advent heralds the prophetic voice of John the Baptist, who preached in word, in deed, and in lifestyle, the clear and powerful message that Jesus is coming among us. Huge crowds of people came to hear John’s condemnations, to embrace repentance, and to be baptized. Some rejected their old ways and changed their lives, while others never really changed and eventually fell away.

Through the power of the Spirit, baptismal grace has the power to shape our lives and our choices. John proclaimed Jesus’ coming, but preached that this good news demanded change, change in the form of repentance and new birth. This change calls us to go beyond our typical or normal mindset to a radical “*open-mindedness*.” It speaks of a change in our vision of life that will bring about a change in the way we live.


John demanded change of those who heard him centuries ago, and change is demanded of us today to brighten our lives with the joy of God’s love. Obviously, it will take massive change to level mountains and fill up valleys. During this Advent season when the world so desperately needs peace, we again hear John’s cry in the wilderness echoed by the strident voices of 21<sup>st</sup> Century prophets. From Fr. Daniel Berrigan SJ, priest, peace activist and poet we hear: ***“We believers are all too cozily comfortable in our culture. ...We must realize that we belong elsewhere...and accept to be whom we are—aliens, wanderers, passers-through, who should not conform to this world.”*** The problem with so many first-world folks is that we often forget that prophetic cry.

Again this Advent there is good news, because Jesus overcomes evil and brings comfort and peace to all who hear and respond. Do we believe it? If we do, may our voices rise with all those in the past who have cried out to shake up our world to a new level of repentance and forgiveness. Then the world will indeed be joyful.


