## LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

How do we convince people that God's law is written upon their hearts? God is wedded to God's people. This is a simple and fundamental fact of life. Yet, many ignore this truth and carry on as if they, or humanity as a whole, are the center of the universe. As a grain of wheat has to fall to the ground and die in order to become what it really is, we too must die to our secular images and ideas of ourselves so that we can become who God really made us to be. If all of us kept our focus on God's deep bonded love with human beings, indeed with our very self, then there would be no need to teach others this fundamental life lesson. They would simply know this truth, as Jeremiah tells us. Somehow, perhaps through original and personal sin, we have lost sight of this reality. We have lost our way and our axis. It is time to find our way back, to learn the virtue of obedience, to pay attention to what God is saying and become aware of the Divine Love that is the reason for all creation. Then, even in our darkest hour when all may seem to be lost, we can say as did Jesus, the model of obedience, "Father, glorify your name." By this perseverance, people can come to know the Lord and what God has done.

## THE ROAD LESS TRAVELED

The familiar phrase, “The road less traveled...” comes from a poem written by the great American poet, Robert Frost. Perhaps you might remember it: *“Two roads diverged in a yellow wood, and sorry I could not travel both and be one traveler. Long I stood and looked down one as far as I could to where it bent in the undergrowth. Then took the other, just as fair, and having perhaps the better claim, because it was grassy and wanted wear; I*

*shall be telling this with a sigh somewhere ages and ages hence: two roads diverged in a wood, and I took the one less traveled, and that has made all the difference.”*

Robert Frost’s poem creates a vivid image of the road less traveled---a winding, twisting, path overgrown with trees, brush and weeds bending around large boulders. As we approach the end of Lent, the poetic image of the road less traveled reflects Mark’s description of Jesus’ road to Jerusalem, and John’s reminder in today’s Gospel that Jesus choose the road that brought him to *“the hour...for the Son of Man to be glorified,”* that is.... his death. Jesus chose the road less traveled, and those who become his disciples may find themselves on the same road.

Jesus chose the road that has made a great difference for us. His road, clouded in suffering, humiliation and death, led to our redemption. What road will we choose? Will our path be well worn by frequent travelers, or the road less traveled? To follow Jesus, our roadway probably won’t be chosen by the socially acceptable or the politically correct. It will be a road where Gospel challenges will be taken seriously, requiring travelers to *“turn the other cheek...walk the extra mile...offer their shirts as well as their coats.”*

If we travel along that road, we will see road signs that call us to *“love our enemies...do good to those who hate us... bless those who curse us...pray for those who mistreat us...share with those who ask us.”* Our travel may often be lonely when the toll will require us not to *“return evil for evil,”* and remind us *“...a grain of wheat must die to produce much fruit.”* Traveling this road will require that we not only admire Jesus, but also follow him. Our road map will point out the distinction between followers and admirers crafted by Soren Kierkegaard, the Danish philosopher who made this distinction: *“a follower strives to be what he or she admires. An admirer however, remains personally detached and at a safe distance.”*

Jesus’ life on earth was focused on gathering followers whom he formed into disciples. Jesus created the model, set the pace, and invited followers to join him on a journey of suffering and even death to everlasting life. Jesus chose the road to Jerusalem. Will we choose the same road and become his followers even though our trip may include risks and dangers? For each of us, the road we choose will indeed make all the difference.

### **Financial Aid for Catholic Education**

St. Mary's Congregation is offering financial aid in support of families sending their children to St. Joseph Catholic Academy and All Saints Catholic School. These programs are open to all registered, active members of the Parish.

The Tuition Assistance grant is to families that might not be financially able to send their children to St. Joes or All Saints. This program is not limited to either school or to any particular grade level but is based on need. The amount to be given is at the discretion of the Pastor with the assistance of the selection committee. Tuition Assistance applications are available in the parish office and can also be found on the Parish's website. The Application with all required supporting documents are due in the Parish Office by noon on April 30, 2021. If you have any questions regarding the Tuition Assistance program you can contact Fr. The second program is the St. Mary's Scholarship program that the parish has offered for a number of years to worthy eighth grade students who will attend St. Joseph Academy as a ninth grader for the 2021-2022 school year. The Parish is again offering two one-time scholarships of \$500.00. Scholarship applications are available in the parish office, and at All Saints School and St. Joe's upper campus. Applications can also be found on the Parish's website as well as the St. Joe's and All Saint's websites. The Application and the necessary supporting documents must be received at the Parish office by noon on April 7, 2021.






**Prayer Shawl Ministry**
