HOLY FAMILIES

Anyone familiar with the evening news can certainly attest to the variety of tragic images that flash across our TV screens. We experience stories of parents abandoning children, children mistreating elderly parents, children killed by violence, and unwanted babies left in public places. Families in poverty further cloud the picture, where hunger, poor health, inadequate housing and educational concerns erode family bonds. The list of family tragedies is staggering, causing us to wonder what has happened to humanity's basic unit that theologians call the Domestic Church.

The Holy Family revealed in today's Gospel was not without its own struggles. Missionary author, Joseph Donders, reminds us that there were struggles in Jesus' family reflected in the following headlines pulled from the gospels: "BETROTHED FEELS JILTED." "FAMILY FORCED TO FLEE." "CHILD MISSING IN JERUSALEM." "SON ARESTED AND EXECUTED." "MOTHER GRIEVES AT SON'S DEATH." The family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, like many families today, experienced both sadness and joy; yet, their willingness to challenge tragedy dramatically changed our world.


Prayerfulness and forgiveness are the glue that holds families together. The characteristics of love, kindness, prayerfulness and forgiveness are key in maintaining and strengthening family life. Treating family members with love and kindness allows them to become all that they can be, and nurtures and strengthens family bonds. Prayerfulness and forgiveness are the glue that holds families together, especially during tragic times. These characteristics that made family life formative for the Holy Family over 2000 years ago, are the same characteristics that sustain family life today. The following set of beatitudes may prove inspirational to families today:


"Blessed are those who have genuine sorrow; the rest of the family will console and support them. Blessed are those who can admit their mistakes; they will remain within the family's embrace. Blessed are those who hunger to forgive; the family will offer them many opportunities. Blessed are those whose lips say, "I'm sorry;" the same will be spoken to them. Blessed are those hearts that burn with generous forgiveness; they will know God's forgiveness. Blessed are those who work for family peace; they will be counted as members of God's family. Blessed are those who are willing to overcome misunderstanding; they will be given a deeper understanding of God's forgiving love."

Richard Sklba, Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus of Milwaukee, has often reminded us: "We are born into a time not of our choosing and given a task not always to our liking. And we will find God there or not at all, for God is nowhere else." Today's gospel lesson is all about our search for God in the midst of family struggle. Family is the setting where the quest begins, and family is the place where we begin to learn who we are. It's never perfect but it is a powerful force in our on-going relationship with Jesus. In that day-to-day struggle, we hope to remain faithful. Our joys and our sorrows remind us that we are always children of God, at our worst and at our best. That is what being a member of the family and a child of God requires, whether your name is Mary, Joseph, or


