Don't forget the Lenten Fish Fries are fast approaching. Watch the bulletin for more details.



### SAINT OF THE WEEK

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."

#### **EPIPHANIES EVERYWHERE**

Each Christmas season, we assemble our crib figures and arrange them in their prominent place, but whatever their size or shape, we know our stable scene is not complete until the arrival of the wise men. Our home crèches are usually assembled long before Christmas because they have become a vital part of our holiday decorating plan. Often, to be sure we don't forget to add the wise men, we stick them in long before the feast of Epiphany.

In some families, the tradition is to have the wise men appear at Christmas but placed a distance away from the stable in plain view. Each day after Christmas, they are moved closer to the nativity scene. Finally, on Epiphany, they arrive at the stable. Some may label this a silly tradition, but it makes an important point. The arrival of the wise men from the East represent a challenge to those who believed themselves to be among the chosen. Their arrival reminds us that God's love accepts everyone, a belief we still struggle to uphold.

Spiritual writer Alice Camille gives us a different view of these wise travelers who followed the star to Jesus:

Epiphanies remind us that God simply wants to be known to us.

"Historically, it's all wrong. The kings may not have really been kings, the three were not necessarily three, and they may not have represented different races. ... The main idea however, is that foreign powers would one day acknowledge the light of Christ and that sometimes, it takes a new eye to see what is all too familiar to those of us who see it all the time. The magi... were sincere in their quest for the truth, willing to humble themselves in the presence of the infant king, and prepared to offer their worldly wealth at the end of their journey. In this sense they proved that they were wise, they were noble, and yes, sons of the King."

These wise travelers found Jesus after a long and dangerous journey. Like those ancient travelers who followed their star, we too travel our lifetimes to find Jesus' presence. It is a daily effort as we continually move closer to finding him more often reflected in the faces and events of our


lives. Like the magi, we are born with a call that must be answered, a vision to be followed, and a goal to be achieved. Again Alice Camille states the idea well: "God is always lifting the veil between heaven and earth and affording us a look-see! The beauty of the natural world, the encounter of love, healing, forgiveness, and compassion are all examples of ongoing epiphanies. God simply wants to be known to us."

Each week as we gather for liturgy, we complete another leg of our journey toward our God. "With joy, O God, my feet are taking me up to your house, to my church, with the same joy as once long ago prayerful pilgrims climbed to your holy temple in Jerusalem. Holy is this weekly pilgrimage, the journey my heart takes to be nearer to you. ...May today's going and returning be...journeys to and from your two holy houses, the shrine of my church and my home, both holy houses of prayer." [Fr. Ed Hays]

As we complete our stable scene with all the players present, let us remember that we are indeed on a journey and as we travel, we need constant reminders that we are still on the right path. Let our stable gathering be such a reminder no matter when our wise men join the celebration.
