DIVINE INTIMACY

Today our Scriptures speak of the "daring" love of God who seeks intimacy with us. Israel's God was not content to establish a creator-creature relationship, but he invited us to become intimate partners. This partnership is best illustrated by the wedding celebration theme where the love relationship between a bride and groom is so visibly evident. Our God wants a "spousal relationship" with us, founded on mutual love. It is within this wedding image that Isaiah reminds us of God's loving promise, "*As a bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so shall your God rejoice in you.*" [Isaiah 62:5]

From the beginning of human life, God was intimately involved in our existence. Priest and poet, Father Ed Hays described our intimate beginning: "God the Potter knelt by the river in Eden and scooped up handfuls of clay with which God shaped the beautiful body of the first human, Adam. He however, lay lifeless on the earth. ...God took a bucket to the river and filled it. He poured the entire bucket over Adam, but he did not move. God returned to the river and poured bucket after bucket over Adam, until he opened one eye, then the other. Now overflowing with the fluid Spirit of Life, Adam danced and God smiled."


At Cana, Jesus proclaimed his teaching. He came to pour bucket upon bucket of his teachings over us until we

To think of God as spouse demands a sharing that is mutually intimate and constant. become filled to overflowing with the fluid spirit of Jesus' truth and wisdom. Then fully soaked with his goodness, we will be able to open one eye and then the other and rise up and dance the dance of new life. Spiritual writer, Patricia Sanchez describes this Godhuman relationship in this way: "*At the wedding at Cana, Jesus, the Divine Spouse, has become the incarnate Bridegroom inviting each believer to a new covenant relationship, revealed in the saving blood of Jesus on the cross and celebrated in the Eucharistic bread of his body.*"

With great eagerness and excitement, God calls Israel "spouse." To think of and relate to God as spouse demands a sharing that is mutually intimate and constant. This kind of rela-

tionship is not possible if we imagine our Creator as C.E.O. directing our lives, or C.P.A. keeping track of our behavior. The real scandal highlighted in this story is not the tragedy of no wine but of no passion! When our God becomes our life giving, caring, supporting and loving spouse, we glimpse a God of enormous passion, a passion that is revealed over and over, bucket after bucket by signs, invitations, overtures and epiphanies.

This New Year signals the continuation of the relationship begun so long ago as we sprang to life formed by the hands of our creator. Today's wedding image at Cana asks us to examine our own fidelity to God's great love. Are we ready for such an intimate love relationship? Will we be able to change, repair and renew whatever damage has been done to that marriage image? Is God's passionate love for us reflected in the enduring love we share with others? Our response to these questions strengthens or weakens the bond of love yearned for by our God. ----Deacon Wilson Shierk


