THE JESUS AGENDA

"What's on your agenda today?" That question often controls the structure of our day. Sometimes our agendas are crystal clear and known far in advance, but at other times they are in flux, developing as the day unfolds. Some are carefully written and thoughtfully edited, some are scribbled on calendars or bits of paper trucked in pocket or purse, while still others are a quickly written list of reminders. Some days we could care less about them allowing our day to flow where it will, while on other days we pledge allegiance to our agendas.

Jesus had an agenda that he set for himself---one that had been outlined centuries before by the prophet Isaiah. That agenda was the law established and adopted by the people of Israel since the time of Moses. For many years, that law was interpreted, expanded, debated, and often misrepresented as Israel attempted to remain faithful to it. In today's gospel, Jesus chose to read from the prophet Isaiah to announce his agenda that proclaimed the good news of healing and liberation. That same agenda is renewed again today as the Church's agenda and our agenda as well. It was not by accident that Jesus selected the Isaiah scroll and proclaimed his destiny for all to hear. As theologian

Leonardo Boff reminded us, "Jesus came to save and liberate humankind from sin, but he also came to liberate humankind from all other forms of brokenness as well; sickness, poverty, injustice, corruption and inequality." For Jesus, salvation and freedom from brokenness are not goals for the afterlife, but goals that shape the existence of people in this life. His agenda was the call to work for justice here and now wherever inequality exists. That is the cornerstone of Jesus' agenda.


Leonardo Boff also reminded us that Jesus preached about a "God to whom believers have access, not primarily through prayer and religious observance, but through service to the poor, in whom God lies hidden and anonymous." Jesus called for partnerships with the outcasts of society. No wonder his agenda, proclaimed so long ago in the synagogue at Nazareth, was so angrily rejected. It established a new way of looking at God and at the world, by

avoiding wealth and power because they tend to dominate lives and prevent true stewardship. That agenda confronts the plight of the poor among us, because poverty remains a lasting form of violence that affects the lives of thousands of our brothers and sisters.

Down through the centuries, the church has attempted to remind us of our true purpose and help us to refocus our energies toward it. Over 50 years ago the World Synod of Catholic Bishops issued a 77 point document entitled, "Justice in the World." In part they said: "Action on behalf of justice and participation in the transformation of the world fully appear to us as a constitutive (essential) dimension of the preaching of the gospel." Pope Francis recently reminded us: "Christian life is meant to have an impact on society." Therefore, the mission of the Church, its agenda and ours, is the liberation of humanity from every oppressive situation. This is not an optional alternative, but a breathtaking challenge for the Church until oppression vanishes from the earth.
