## First Reading Is 50:4-7

The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame.

## Responsorial Psalm Ps 22

## Second Reading Phil 2:6-11

Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

## From the Pastor's Desk...

*Ave Maria, Regina Angelorum! Hail Mary, Queen of Angels!*

About a year and a half ago a Pew study (from the pew research center) made Catholic news with the announcement that only a third of Catholics in the United States affirmed belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The last couple of weeks I've been reviewing in this column an encyclical letter of Pope

Paul VI on the Eucharist entitled *Mysterium Fidei*.

He writes in this letter that "the Eucharist is the flesh of Our Savior Jesus Christ which suffered for our sins and which the Father in His loving kindness raised again... The Lord did not say: This is symbol of my body, and this is a symbol of my blood, but rather: This is my body and my blood. He teaches us not to look to the nature of what lies before us and is perceived by the senses, because the giving of thanks and the words spoken over it have changed it into flesh and blood." (§144)

Citing the council of Trent, Pope Paul VI states that "after the consecration of the bread and wine, Our Lord Jesus Christ, true God and man, is really, truly and substantially contained in the Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist under the outward appearances of sensible things." Jesus is present "in the sacrament of the Eucharist in a manner of existing that we can hardly express in words but that our minds, illumined by faith, can come to see as possible to God and that we must most firmly believe." (§145)

The time is always ripe to contemplate this great mystery, and after over a year of being dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, an in-depth reflection on the Eucharist seemed beneficial. Especially in our season of Lent as we prepare for the great celebration of Easter and the new life which we receive in Christ who has conquered sin and death, what better could we do than turn to his most sacred presence on the altar and in the tabernacle?

"The way in which Christ becomes present in this Sacrament is through the conversion of the whole substance of the bread into His body and of the whole substance of the wine into His blood, a unique and truly wonderful conversion that the Catholic Church fittingly and properly calls transubstantiation." (§146) St. Cyril of Jerusalem writes that "what seems to be bread is not bread—though it tastes like it—but rather the Body of Christ; and that what seems to be wine is not wine—even though it too tastes like it—but rather the Blood of Christ... draw strength from receiving this bread as spiritual food and your soul will rejoice." (§148)

Pope Paul VI goes on to reaffirm the constant teaching of Christ's real presence in the Eucharist and the worship (or "latria" in Latin) of the Eucharist which is fitting only for God. (§155) The Pope desired that greater devotion to and reverence for the Eucharist would be fostered by his encyclical, not only in Eucharistic adoration but also in daily Mass attendance and reception of Holy Communion. He points out that the tabernacle is to be the spiritual center of a parish community. (§168) "Devotion to the divine Eucharist exerts a great influence upon the soul in the direction of fostering a "social" love, in which we put the common good ahead of private good, take up the cause of the community... and extend our charity to the whole world because we know that there are members of Christ everywhere." (§169)

May our faith in the Eucharist and our desire to receive our Lord ever increase in these final days of Lent.


