

# From the Pastoral Associate's Desk...

"So then the Lord Jesus, after He had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God."

These words from the Gospel of Mark recount Our Lord's Ascension into Heaven, which took place 40 days after the Resurrection. In some dioceses, this is celebrated on the Thursday of this week, acknowledging the literal 40<sup>th</sup> day after Easter. However, most dioceses, including ours, the celebration is transferred to next Sunday.

When we speak about the Paschal Mystery, was usually focus only on the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. However, it also includes the Ascension too!

Next time you are at Mass, see if you can notice the words Fr. Zak says during the Eucharistic prayer. There are multiple options he can pick from, but he will usually pray: "Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the blessed Passion, the Resurrection from the dead, and the **glorious Ascension into Heaven** of Christ, Your Son, our Lord, we, Your servants and Your holy people, offer to Your glorious majesty, from the gifts that You have given us, this pure victim, this holy victim, this spotless victim, the holy Bread of eternal life and the Chalice of everlasting salvation" or "Therefore, O Lord, we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of Your Son, His wondrous Resurrection and **Ascension into Heaven**, and as we look forward to His second coming, we offer You in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice."

Although I was raised Catholic and was taught the faith from an early age, I hardly paid attention to the Ascension or its importance in the Christian life. However, the Ascension completes Christ's journey of salvation and shows us the way home. It reveals the direction we are all called to follow as Christians, to be reunited with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in an Eternal Communion of everlasting love.

Therefore, we each need to reflect upon the true reality that **we will live forever**....it is simply a question of where! The choice is in our hands – and our hearts. What will we choose to love most? Will we seek to follow the Lord and obey His commandments? Or will we become distracted and consumed by the temporary pleasures of this life and forget about the eternal goodness God desires for us? Let us remain united to Him through the Sacraments, love with humility and generosity, and seek to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of our life! **~Chris**

#### From the Office of Liturgy & Music

Now that we have the kneeler in the front for Communion, let's all take a trip back to Second Grade, and refresh ourselves on how to receive Jesus in the Eucharist! First off, the Church, in the Mass of Pope Paul VI, which we celebrate here, there are two methods of reception allowed: On the tongue, or on the hand.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states when distributing, "the Priest raises the host slightly and shows it to each, saying, "The Body of Christ." The communicant replies, "Amen", and receives the Sacrament either on the tongue or, where this is allowed, in the hand, the choice lying with the communicant. As soon as the communicant receives the host, he or she consumes the whole of it" (GIRM 161).

If receiving on the hand, make a "throne" with your hands, with your dominant hand underneath. The Church teaches we should regard each particle of the Consecrated Host as more valuable than gold! After receiving Communion, do not move away until you have fully consumed the Host.

If you receive on the tongue, after saying "Amen", stick out your tongue, hold still, and wait for the priest to give you Communion. If you choose to use the kneeler, simply kneel down first, then follow the above steps.

Finally, if Communion is offered under both species (Body and Blood) and you choose not to receive the Blood, the GIRM asks that you reverently bow before the Precious Blood, as it is still the True Presence of Jesus Christ!
