From the Pastor's Desk...

Ave Maria, Regina Angelorum! Hail Mary, Queen of Angels!

Happy birthday! Today we celebrate the birthday of the Church, the day the promised Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles and Mary in the upper room and they began to preach the Gospel in many languages.

As our Easter season comes to a close with today's solemnity, we will conclude the reflection we began last week on the hymn "At the Lamb's High Feast We Sing."

Mighty Victim from the sky, hell's fierce pow'rs beneath you lie. You have conquered in the fight, you have brought us life and light. Now no more can death appall, now no more the grave enthrall; you have opened paradise, and your saints in you shall rise

Verse three opens with an image that reminds me of the Easter icon of Christ standing on the gates of hell. Jesus Christ is our Lord, victorious over sin and death in his resurrection. The evil one, the enemy of our race, is shown in this icon bound hand and foot under Christ's feet, as our Lord raises Adam and Eve out of their graves - an image of the new Life the Savior brings to us on Easter morning and through our



reception of the Sacraments. The later part of this third verse of our hymn recalls Saint Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 15:54 "Death is swallowed up in victory." This verse ends as does the creed, with a proclamation of our faith in the resurrection of the body and eternal life.

Easter triumph, Easter joy! This alone can sin destroy; from sin's pow'r, Lord, set us free, newborn souls in you to be. Father, who the crown shall give, Savior, by whose death we live, Spirit, quide through all our days, Three in One, your name we praise.

The last verse opens with a surge of glory, as we praise and revel in the Lord's goodness. We must be careful to understand the words properly: Only the joy of the risen Lord can destroy sin. It is this faith and the love, joy and peace that it brings to our heart that frees us from sin and claims us for Christ. I think of the great emotion in the book of Revelation when Christ the risen Lamb comes forward to open the scroll with seven seals, as the elders and living creatures around the heavenly throne sing "Worthy art thou to take the scroll and to open its seals, for thou wast slain and by thy blood didst ransom men for God" (Rev. 5:9).

Not only do we rejoice in Christ's victory, but just as we do in the prayers of every Mass, we make our petition to the heavenly Father that this victory may win us grace and salvation - that we may share in his victory and the new life which has come to us at Baptism. So many of the prayers of the Church are made up of such praise and petition, recognizing the Lord's power and goodness and his marvelous works, and begging that it may take effect in our lives through our participation in faith and especially through the sacraments.

The hymn ends with a traditional doxology, calling on each Divine Person of the Trinity by name. What a beautiful prayer of the Church, written I believe 1600 years ago, allowing us to pray with the whole patrimony of the Church. Praised be Jesus Christ!
