From the Pastoral Associate's Desk...

The Eucharistic revival we have entered into is aimed at returning us to the heart of true worship. Throughout the next three years, the Church will continue to put special focus on understanding what Jesus offers to His Church in the gift of the Holy Eucharist.

Last week, Pope Francis published an apostolic letter detailing his desire for the world to consider in new ways the depths of God's love made present in the liturgy. He shared the following thoughts:

"The world still does not know it, but everyone is invited to the supper of the wedding of the Lamb. We must not allow ourselves even a moment of rest, knowing that still not everyone has received an invitation to this Supper or knowing that others have forgotten it or have got lost along the way in the twists and turns of human living...Before our response to His invitation — well before! — there is His desire for us. We may not even be aware of it, but every time we go to Mass, the first reason is that we are drawn there by His desire for us. Indeed, every reception of communion of the Body and Blood of Christ was already desired by Him in the Last Supper...we need to be present at that Supper, to be able to hear His voice, to eat His Body and to drink His Blood. We need Him. In the Eucharist and in all the sacraments we are guaranteed the possibility of encountering the Lord Jesus and of having the power of his Paschal Mystery reach us. The salvific power of the sacrifice of Jesus, His every word, His every gesture, glance, and feeling reaches us through the celebration of the sacraments. The Lord Jesus who dies no more, who lives forever with the signs of His Passion continues to pardon us, to heal us, to save us with the power of the sacraments. It is the concrete way, by means of His incarnation, that He loves us. It is the way in which He satisfies His own thirst for us that He had declared from the cross."

As a parish, we are called to reflect upon the gift of the Mass. We know very concretely what it was like to go without the Mass for many months. Now that our opportunity for authentic worship has returned, consider anew how God is drawing you to Himself in the Eucharist. Pray and reflect about how you receive Him – both the external devotion you show receiving Him on the tongue or in the hand, as well as the internal devotion you offer Him in your heart.

Do you have friends who have been away from Church for a while? Invite them to join you on Sunday! The invitation is for EVERYONE! Let us not rest until all have beheld the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, who calls us to partake in His Supper. Let us work and pray together that every person will hear His voice, find real healing in their soul, and know in their heart the love He offers them in the Eucharist!

From the Office of Liturgy & Music

How is the "Agnus Dei" (Lamb of God) supposed to be sung? Differently than most people would think!

Lets start with the GIRM (General instruction on the Roman Missal), Number 83: "The supplication "Agnus Dei", is, as a rule, sung by the choir or cantor with the people responding..." This means that the cantor or choir sings "Agnus Dei" or "Lamb of God" alone, then the congregation responds with "Qui tollis peccata Mundi, Miserere nobis" or "You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us." Then, when the verse repeats the next two times, ONLY the choir should sing the "Lamb of God" part, with the congregation responding the third time as "Dona nobis pacem," or "Grant us peace."

There is one more part that is known a bit more commonly: "this invocation accompanies the fraction, and, for this reason, may be repeated as many times as necessary until the rite has reached its conclusion, the last time ending with the words "Dona nobis pacem." The fraction rite is when the priest breaks the main host into smaller pieces, and, depending on the priest, this can take some time, so we are allowed to repeat the first phrase as often as necessary during this time. This is common in large parishes, but we do not usually need to repeat more than the three time normally.

There you go, a nice short one this week!
