EUCHARISTIC SAINT FOR AUGUST

St. Alphonsus Ligouri was a bishop, doctor of the church, and the founder of the Redemptorist Congregation. In celebrating Mass, his face was radiant with joy. After the Consecration, he would blush from the intensity of his emotion. He writes, "My most courte-

ous Lord, when you enter my soul in Holy Communion, you unite with and give yourself to me, so that in all truth I can say: My Jesus, now you are all mine." Regarding Eucharistic adoration, he says, "Pause for a while each day before Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Know that the time you spend in devotion before this most divine Sacrament will be the most fruitful in your life; it will comfort you when you die and in eternity. Give your whole self to the Lord who has given all things to you! Approach the Blessed Sacrament "as the burning bush" in order to catch fire and set others ablaze. St. Alphonsus died in 1787 at the age of 91. His feast day is Aug. 1.

This weekend we are also excited to be using for the first time the new sound system in the Church! This sound system was purchased with the funds received from the "Parish in Need"

In our Gospel passage, our Lord speaks to the apostles through the understanding of a servant/master relationship. Our day and age tends to shy away from this sort of "servant" mentality, unless it comes to us through popular TV shows or it is someone who is serving ourselves. However, this relationship has deeper qualities about it that reveal a number of aspects that are important to the spiritual life. We must begin by reflecting upon the characteristics of the Master, of the one whom we serve. The Master put forth by our Lord in the Gospel is a man who is just to his servants, as we see him in turn serving those who were faithful and awaiting his return. On the other hand, the Master also expects the servants to be doing their job and awaiting his return. In both cases, the Master is the one who guides the servants, and sets forth the expectations for them. In our own spiritual lives, it is important that we discern what or who are the Masters that we allow to direct us? What are the places of emphasis in our lives? If the ultimate focus of our lives is not rooted in God, and his vocation for our lives, then we must take the time to refocus, and discern where He is calling us to Himself. Our treasure must be a heavenly treasure, authentic love of God and neighbor, virtue, grace, mercy. If we strive for the things that are above, and begin to rid ourselves of what is not of God, then our Master will find us ready at his delayed coming. **Fr. Spenser St. Louis**

From the Office of Liturgy & Music

Active participation: What is it? As many people know, the Constitution on Sacred Liturgy (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*), from the start of the Second Vatican Council, called for "full and active participation" in the Liturgy by the faithful. What does that mean, exactly?

Let's start with the history of "active participation." While many people know this phrase from Vatican II, it is actually a very traditional ideal, with some versions popping up as early as the 600s, with the promulgation of Gregorian chant, and with more recent changes in the late 1800s with the revival of said Chant, and then once more at the Second Vatican Council. So, what does this mean in our modern context?

Let's look to Pope Benedict XVI, the most recent pope to explain this. He states: "we must not overlook the fact that some misunderstanding has occasionally arisen concerning the precise meaning of this participation." He continues, "It should be made clear that the word "participation" does not refer to mere external activity during the celebration. In fact, the active participation called for by the Council must be understood in more substantial terms, on the basis of a greater awareness of the mystery being celebrated and its relationship to daily life" (Sacramentum Caritatis, 52).

In practice, this means a few things: interiorly, in order to be active participants, we must be in a state of grace before Mass. This means examining our conscience, and if we find ourselves to be in a state of grave sin, go to confession. We must be free of attachments to the outside world. Remember, when we enter the nave for Mass, we are entering a new world. We then focus ourselves on a prayerful disposition above all else, offering our hearts to the Lord.

We may also pray along with the Mass. We listen (and sometimes read along) with the readings. We participate in the Prayers of the Faithful (petitions). If we sing, we sing principally the dialogues of Mass, and the Propers (Introit, Offertory Antiphon, and Communion Antiphon), as well as chanting the Prayers of the Faithful and the Creed. These are the parts of the Mass which we may exteriorly participate in. It is important to note, however, that the Mass will happen with or without us, as we are not priests.

One could (and does) write entire dissertations on this subject, but, at its most basic, to "actively participate" means to "prayerfully participate" in the Mass itself, which is so much more than a "mere external activity."
