

From the Pastor...

He is risen! He is risen, indeed! As we continue to journey through this Easter Season, we come to a time in the year where we celebrate the Feasts of many of the Apostles, as well as the Evangelists. We are also in a period of the liturgical life of the Church where we keep hearing from the Acts of the Apostles, the Book of the Bible that recounts the early period of the Church. In each of these aspects of the Easter Season, we are invited to remember that as beloved Children of God, and especially as Baptized Catholics, we are given an incredible gift, a gift that is meant to be fully investigated, the gift of faith. Faith is not just something that we receive at Baptism, rather it is

meant to be a part of the foundation of our lives. Our faith is meant to be a part of who we are, not simply an attribute or obligation we find ourselves entering into each week. Why is this? It's because our faith invites us into that relationship with God that should radically change who we are, and inform what our purpose is in this life. This is the very essence of the Acts of the Apostles, that being given that time spent with our Lord, and the gifts of the Holy Spirit, they are enlivened by the faith to go forth and proclaim the Good News of the Gospel by the witness of their lives. The Apostles and disciples of the Lord were sent out, to proclaim the Good News, just as we ourselves are also being sent into the world at the conclusion of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass: "Go forth, the Mass is ended. Thanks be to God!" In the original Latin translation of the Mass, it was *Ite Missa Est*, "Go, You are sent." In this understanding we realize and make present the reality that the Mass is not simply something that takes place in a finite time, and it's not something that we do and allow it to be done. The Mass, rather, is something that we are being sent to do. In these words, we see the same root between being *sent* and the word *mission*, *Missa*. We are being entrusted with the mission to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world, to bring Christ, the Light of the world, to the world.

Next weekend, on May 5th, we will celebrate the First Holy Communion of our 2nd graders. They will receive for the first time the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Eucharistic Lord, something that will radically change their lives. I ask that in these days leading up to this Sacrament of Initiation that we as a parish pray for these young lives, that they may be prepared by the Holy Spirit to receive worthily and well our Eucharistic Lord, and that he might forever change their lives as a result of their encounter with Jesus.


