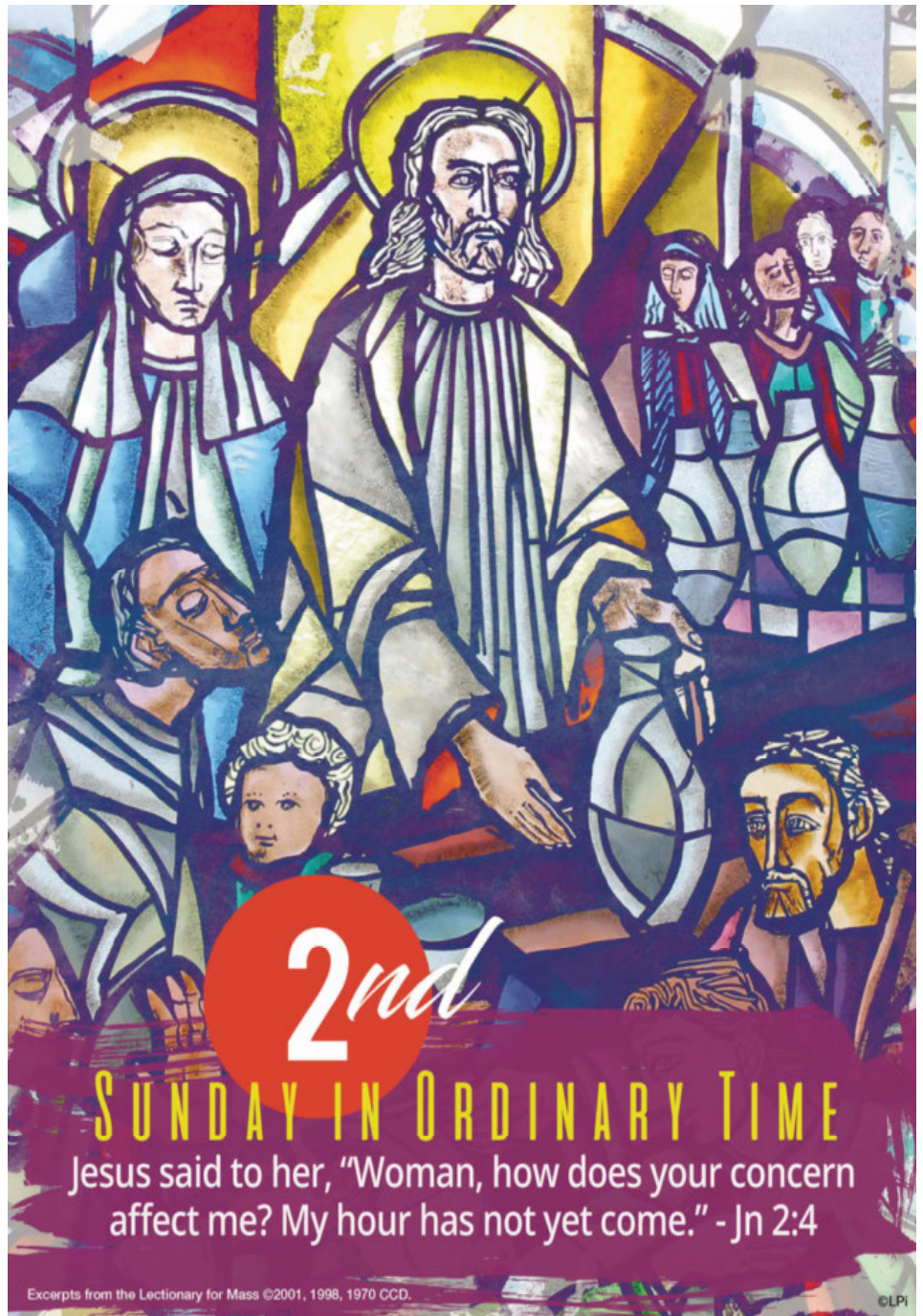

Ordinary Time I (After the Baptism)

We return to an explanation of the Liturgical year in our Catholic Faith.

After the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which ordinarily occurs on the Sunday after the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, the Season of Christmas closes and Ordinary Time begins. The weekdays that follow the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord are reckoned as belonging to the first week of Ordinary Time which continues until the Tuesday that immediately precedes Ash Wednesday. Ordinary Time is divided into two sections (one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time, and then another lasting about six months, after Easter Time), wherein the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people. Although it might come as a surprise, ordinary time is not called "ordinary" based on its level of importance. The origin of the name Ordinary Time comes from the Latin word "ordinalis", which means "numbered or showing order", denoting an order of succession. It is used in this sense to refer to the order of the counted weeks; that is to say, it is a season of counted weeks. Ordinary Time, which occurs between Christmas and Lent, then again between Easter and Advent, signifies a numbered (or ordered) list of Sundays that anchor our daily lives in the Catholic Church.

The mystery of Christ, unfolded through the cycle of the year, calls us to live His mystery in our own lives. This call is best illustrated in the lives of Mary and the saints, celebrated by the Church throughout the year. There is no tension between the mystery of Christ and the celebration of the saints, but rather a marvelous harmony. The Blessed Virgin Mary is joined by an inseparable bond to the saving work of her Son, and the feasts of all the saints proclaim the wonderful works of Christ in His servants and offer the faithful fitting examples for the imitation.

Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the Incarnation, Passion and Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things, including us, are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in the second part of Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, usually in November.

Ordinary Time after the Baptism focuses on the early life of Christ and then on his public ministry.

The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green. However, as in all seasons, other appropriate colors are worn on particular feast days.

The parishes sent off a check on January 6, 2022, to Heifer International for the youth Advent Service project raising money to help international families. Heifer links communities and helps bring sustainable agriculture and commerce to areas of the world with a long history of poverty. The animals provide partners with both food and reliable income, as agricultural products such as milk, eggs and honey can be traded or sold at market.

Thank you to all who participated in the Advent Service Experience sponsored by the youth of our parishes. The check sent was for \$690.00, which enabled Heifer International to provide one heifer, one goat, and three hives of honey bees.
