### Mass Intentions

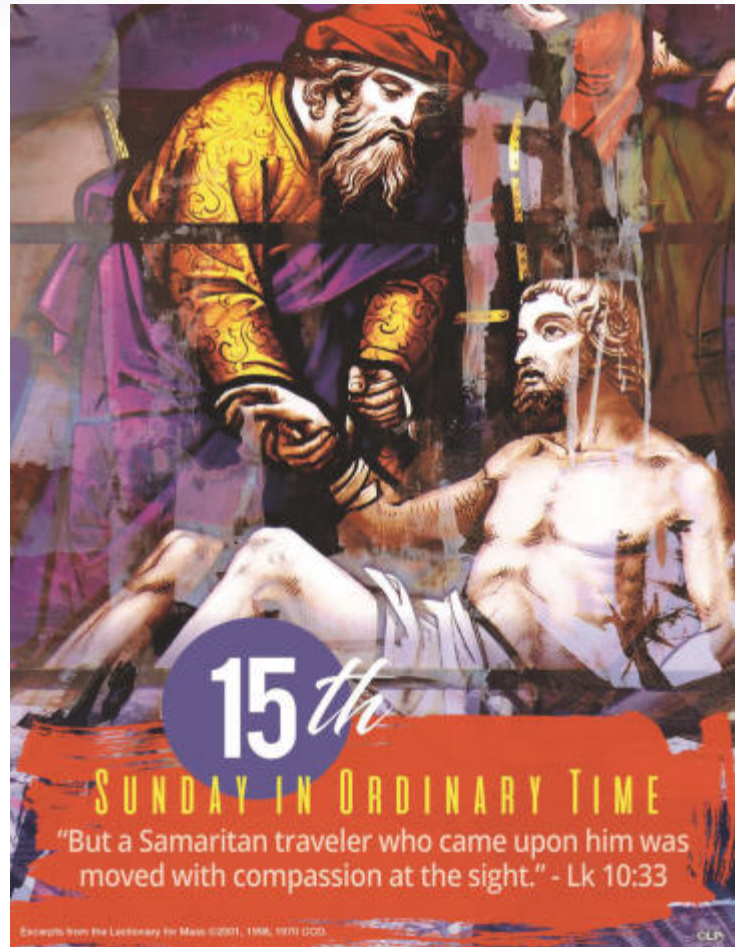

**WORDS FROM FATHER.....** Dear brothers and sisters,  
 we read this weekend the famous parable of the Good  
 Samaritan. This story is no stranger to us: a man is ambushed by  
 robbers and left for dead; a priest and a Levite each happen to  
 come across the dying man but do nothing to help him; finally a  
 Samaritan happens to find this victim and, unlike the previous  
 characters, does all he can to nurse him back to health. Some inter-  
 pretations of this parable teach that this story is connected to the  
 "Golden Rule" - a universal teaching that one should treat others  
 just as how one wishes to be treated by others. While this is true to  
 a certain point, by looking closer into this parable we can also learn  
 that the Good Samaritan story has an even deeper meaning signifi-  
 cance. The priest and the Levite did not simply ignore the dying  
 man. In Jewish teaching, to touch someone who was dead or dying  
 was to make oneself ritually unclean. And  
 being unclean would forbid someone from being able to attend  
 worship. And further, this meant that one would end up being  
 ostracized from his or her community. Therefore, we can argue  
 that it wasn't indifference but rather fear that caused the two peo-  
 ple to not help the poor victim. With this in mind, when we reflect  
 on the actions of the Good Samaritan, we realize that he had taken  
 upon a great sacrifice by helping the beaten man. Not only is he  
 spending all his money and resources to help him, but he is also  
 allowing himself to become unclean and shunned by coming into  
 contact with the tainted. However, Jesus teaches us that by taking  
 upon this burden and sacrifice, this Good Samaritan was not only  
 the true Good Neighbor, but he is also the  
 example that we are to follow after. In our society we are taught  
 and trained to treat others fairly based on the Golden Rule. But on  
 the other hand, we must ask ourselves if we are willing to help oth-  
 ers even if it costs us greatly: are we willing to give up not only our  
 riches and possessions, but also our reputation,  
 status, dreams and opportunities. It is certainly a daunting  
 demand that goes beyond the call of the Golden Rule.  
 In response, let us reaffirm our faith in Christ our savior, that as  
 we offer ourselves as a sacrifice so that good may spread in this  
 world, God will always be watching over us. And thus, there is  
 nothing to fear. **Father Chahm**

### Do you know.....ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA?

On July 14th, we celebrate the feast of the "Lily of the Mohawks." St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American woman to be canonized. Orphaned by a smallpox outbreak, Kateri survived with severe scarring and impaired eyesight. Despite tragedy, she was a devout girl at a young age, often building crosses from sticks in the woods. When she was 18, she began secret instruction in the Catholic faith with French missionaries. Her commitment to Christianity and vow of virginity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers. She escaped to a nearby mission, where she attended daily Mass, taught the children, and cared for the sick and the elderly. Sometimes the greatest misunderstandings can come from those closest to us. Like St. Kateri, God invites us to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love.

### Understanding the Eucharist

What is it that is so special about the Eucharist? Although the Eucharist appears to be simple bread and wine, it is actually the "source and summit" of the Christian life. In order to more deeply understand the truth and beauty of Christ's real presence in the Eucharist, St. Michael the Archangel Parish will offer a new 3-part series called "Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist", which explores the truth and beauty of Christ's real presence in the Eucharist, from its origins in Sacred Scripture, to its profound role in the life of the Church and her members. This series will take place on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 PM in the St. Ignatius basement on July 17, 24, and 31. All are welcome to attend.


