**WORDS FROM FATHER.....** Dear brothers and sisters,  
 our readings this weekend focus on the topic of prayer. Yet they  
 lead us to the topic of one's relationship with God. In our Gospel  
 from Luke, Jesus' disciples ask Him to teach them how to pray.  
 The disciples must have noticed something different and unique  
 with Jesus' way of prayer. The Scripture goes on to introduce the  
 famous Lord's prayer, but one strong characteristic of this prayer is  
 that Jesus addresses God as Father. This shows that Jesus has an  
 intimate relationship with God whom He calls as His own Father.  
 But further, Jesus now invites His followers to call God as their  
 Father too. In short, Jesus invites His people to also have this  
 intimate relationship with God. We know very well that when  
 one's relationship with another grows closer a great change occurs  
 with the language that we share with the other. And furthermore,  
 our viewpoint and understanding changes as well. Another  
 interesting thing we discover this weekend is in our first reading  
 from the book of Genesis: the Lord reveals to Abraham his plan to  
 destroy the sinful cities of Sodom and Gomorrah, but Abraham  
 then enters into a back-and-forth-questioning with God, trying to  
 convince Him to give up the plan. It is surprising to witness  
 Abraham actually attempting to change God's mind. And it is  
 more amazing that one can even have such a conversation with  
 God Himself. Perhaps such a dialogue is possible when one shares  
 an intimate relationship with the Lord that Jesus talks about in the  
 Gospel. Brothers and sisters, why don't we then reflect on how we  
 relate with God. Does He feel distant or does He feel like someone  
 who we can approach with ease? Most importantly, let us  
 remember that Christ urges us not to be shy in nurturing a father-  
 child relationship with God the Father. **Father Chahm**

This week we celebrate a spiritual master! Not only is St. Ignatius  
 Loyola the founder of the Jesuits, but the legacy of his life of prayer -  
 - now called Ignatian spirituality ~ inspired believers the world over.  
 Injured as a young soldier, Ignatius spent his time in recovery  
 reading the lives of the saints. They inspired his soul to holy  
 heroism, changing his life forever. Ignatius gathered a group of  
 friends who also desired to be "contemplatives in action," finding  
 God in all circumstances. This became the Jesuits ~ a great  
 missionary and teaching order. Ignatius himself was constantly  
 attuned to his own inner promptings. This self-knowledge ~ open to  
 the movements of the Holy Spirit ~ led him to be an incredibly  
 astute spiritual director. For Ignatius, recognizing God as the first  
 principle of one's life determined everything.

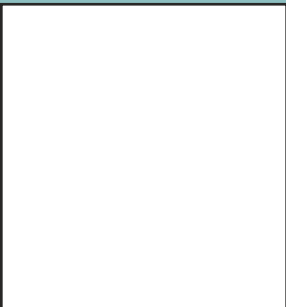


