

A couple of day ago we celebrated Christmas, and maybe you are wondering if I missed the opportunity to wish everyone a Blessed and Merry Christmas in my last bulletin article. Or maybe you are thinking, Fr. Enrique is late again ;) Neither one, (even though I am late all the time) but actually we are celebrating Christmas today, as if today is December 25th, because we are in the Octave of Christmas, where for 8 days we celebrate Christmas. Just like biblical times where weddings feasts went on for days.

So as we reflect on the greatest story of all, the story of our salvation, the great love of God for us. "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." 

'Tis the Season...for Gift Card Scams

Multiple parishioners recently received text messages that appeared to come from Fr. Enrique, asking the recipient for help with an errand. Anyone responding received an automated reply asking for iTunes gift cards for some women battling cancer.



The message did not come from Fr. Enrique and the phone number associated with the call is not his number. Neither of our priests will ever contact parishioners to ask them to purchase gift cards or to send a priest or staff member the numbers on the back of gift cards. This is a common scam intended to defraud good-hearted, generous people who would be willing to help their priest. Please don't fall for it.

Baptism

Holy Family Parish takes its sacramental life most seriously. Parents and godparents who wish to celebrate the sacrament of Baptism are required to attend a one-session preparation program. Classes at Holy Family are usually on the third Saturday of the odd-numbered months at 10:30 am in the Kerstein Center. Please contact the parish office to register. Sessions last about two hours.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is available on Saturdays from 3:30 to 4:00 pm. Please arrive promptly. The Sacrament may also be celebrated by appointment. Seasonal communal celebrations of Reconciliation are observed in collaboration with all the North Shore parishes.

Matrimony

At least six months preparation is required. Please contact the parish office for more information.

Parish Membership

All interested Catholics are invited to register as active members in our parish. Registration usually occurs in McCormick Hall the 1st weekend of the month after all Masses, but until things return to normal you can call the parish office to register by phone. Non-Catholics are invited to call for information on the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA).


