

Parish Trustee Election

Wisconsin law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two-year renewable term, to serve as the legal Board for the parish along with the pastor, the Archbishop and the Vicar General of the Archdiocese. They must be registered parish members, practicing Catholics, and at least 25 years old. Our current trustees are Bob Kowalsky and Bob Roenitz. Bob Kowalsky has served as parish trustee since 2015 and is ready to step down. Father Enrique has nominated Katie Kasper to fill the open position for trustee.

Katie grew up at Holy Family Parish and rejoined with her husband, Dane, in 2018. Her professional background is in financial advisory, and she has served on the boards of several local non-profits. She's a member of the Finance Council, volunteers for the school, and teaches high school religious education. Dane and Katie have five young children, including two who attend Holy Family Parish School.

The parish charter allows any qualified parish member to be nominated or to place his/her name in nomination by submitting a written nomination signed by 10 or more registered adult parish members who are practicing Catholics. Nominations should be received in the parish office by noon on Monday, November 22. Please contact the parish office at 414-332-9220 if you have questions. If there's more than one candidate, an election will be held the weekend of December 11 & 12, 2021.



Dear Brothers and Sisters!

In our talk on the Second Tuesday of the month we talked about the Creed. We profess in the Creed that God is the creator. God's creation expresses something wonderful to us. God did not create out of a need or a void; rather, creation spills out from the love of God. Creation is superabundance; it is an overflow of love from God. All that we see and experience is of God, physical and spiritual. All that exists is a projection from God, an expression of his love for us. Creation is a force from God and the material world can be understood as an expression of God's love for us. As a proper response, the created must express something back to the Creator. Our expression should be one of gratitude and praise, similar to our words at Mass, "It is right and just." This thanksgiving back to God is a natural response. God gives and we say thank you. This is a natural order - the rhythm of creation, a flow from God returning to God in thanksgiving.

To thank God for all that he has provided is to remember God. It is important for us to remember God because God is our life source. However, humanity is inclined to forget; we are inclined to take without remembering the source, unfortunately we are getting used to receive without saying thank you. For us to take and not remember to express our gratitude to God is to break the natural order of creation.

This is what happened when Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit. Our gaze is taken from God and directed on the self. The good news is that through the Pascal mysteries, Jesus expresses the most perfect expression of praise and thanksgiving to God the Father and invites us to join with that expression of praise and thanksgiving by living a sacramental life.

A sacramental life is one that requires us to be good Christian stewards – to remember that all that we have comes from God. Notice that the sacraments themselves require elements of the material world – water, oil, bread, wine, etc. The Christian steward recognizes that the material world and the spiritual world are connected. There is a right response for receiving; thus, participating in the rhythm of creation. The material world must be used to express something to God, that is, how grateful we are for receiving the material.

Our care for the needy, our involvement in parish work, donations to the offertory, and capital campaigns that build churches and schools are investments of the material with the spiritual. Our offerings are responses of gratitude to God in the name of Jesus. We join with Jesus' expression of praise and thanksgiving to the Father. As Christian Catholics, our offerings of time, talent and treasure are not simply good deeds made by good-deed-doers. We are Christ to the world and acting so!




