

The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." From the Gospel of Luke

The Incarnation is a wonderful mystery in which we remember and celebrate when the word of God became flesh. First, it happened in the lowly virgin named Mary. This Incarnation took place through the Holy Spirit when she said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." In that moment, when the angel departed from her, the presence of God now physically began on Earth. Joseph in his own way, saying yes to the Angel's word in his dream, allowed Jesus to become the son of his love. The wise men would pay Him homage and lay their best treasures before him. In doing so, they too gave witness that Jesus

is the true light of the world. As Christians, we are called to hear the Good News and say "Yes" to God in the life of humble obedience, like the Holy Family. Our world is broken and needs more holy men and women; the world is dark and in need of Christians to give witness to the true light. One of my favorite quotes about the Incarnation comes from St. Athanasius, Bishop of Alexandria, he stated: "For the Son of God became man so that we might become like God." It is a very humble statement. Knowing that through this mystery, when we say "Yes" to God, He can make his dwelling on earth in and through us.

As we will celebrate Christmas Masses, each one of you can be sure and certain that you are all remembered at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. All the readings for all the various Christmas liturgies proclaim the same mystery. God not only creates life and pours out grace in the midst of it, he chooses to join us in our lives by becoming one of us. He is Emmanuel, God with us! Whatever the circumstances of your life right now ~ grief or joy, struggle or success, faith or doubt ~ Jesus is right there with you. Choose life with Jesus! Let Him be born again in your heart. Allow Him to enter into your life and give you the life for which you were created.

This is my prayer for you and your families this Christmas: Father, help us to say "Yes" to you, like Mary, like Joseph, and allow your Son to find a home within our hearts. May your word be welcomed within our hearts, helping us to become Holy, as you are Holy. May we too be wise and give our best to you, revealing your presence in this world, first and foremost to our families and to those around us.

I wish a Holy and Blessed Christmas and Peaceful New Year to all my dear parishioners of Holy Family and Saint Robert of Newminster. May the Love, Joy and Peace of Jesus be in your hearts and your homes.

Baptism

Holy Family Parish takes its sacramental life most seriously. Parents and godparents who wish to celebrate the sacrament of Baptism are required to attend a one -session preparation program. Classes at Holy Family are usually on the third Saturday of the odd-numbered months at 10:30 am in the Kerstein Center. Please contact the parish office to register. Sessions last about two hours.

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is available on Saturdays from 3:30 to 4:00 pm. Please arrive promptly. The Sacrament may also be celebrated by appointment. Seasonal communal celebrations of Reconciliation are observed in collaboration with all the North Shore parishes.

Matrimony

At least six months preparation is required. Please contact the parish office for more information.

Parish Membership

All interested Catholics are invited to register as active members in our parish. Registration usually occurs in McCormick Hall the 1st weekend of the month after all Masses, but until things return to normal you can call the parish office to register by phone.
