

Lent is a time to turn again toward the Lord. This Lent at Holy Family, the entire congregation is encouraged to turn toward the Lord once again. The action of turning again to God can be translated into the English word "repentance". We turn toward the Lord through physical ways, such as fasting, almsgiving (donating money) and prayer. Each of these takes time, effort, and a re-evaluation of our daily schedule and priorities. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting, attending an extra daily Mass or stations of the Cross in Lent, or going to confession are great ways to pray. There are myriads of opportunities to give.

You will notice at Holy Family changes in the church during Lent. The color purple replaces green or white, indicating repentance. There will be no use of flowers around the altar and other spaces. Music is supposed to be

reduced to "support singing" but in a way that is more somber and allows more silence. The week before Palm Sunday, images and statues in the Church will again be covered.

What is the point of all this? Well it isn't all about aesthetics. These changes and practices are to be a visual reminder of the interior pilgrimage that we are asked to make. We must do it again and again each year because each year, we begin with good intentions, but we begin to grow weary and weak on the path. This allows us to "turn toward the Lord" together in a more profound way. In the ancient Church, the entire congregation would turn toward the east, that is toward the rising sun as a symbol of the resurrection. This could entail the people facing the priest's back, or the priest facing the people's back, depending on the orientation of the Church. In the contemporary Church, this has fallen out of custom, but what we can all do is face what might be termed a "liturgical east". Pope Benedict coined this term before he became pope, saying that when priest and people together face the cross (that is, priest looking at the altar cross, and people at a cross above the altar like we do at Holy Family,) we are "able to fix our gaze, all of us together, on him who is the Creator, the one who receives us into the cosmic liturgy, and who shows us also the path of history - this is what would enable us to recover the dimension of deep unity that exists between the priest and the faithful within their common priesthood." This means that all of us, priests and people, are facing the cross.

Each year we must "re-orient" ourselves. It literally means to "turn back to the east" again, to Jesus who in His resurrection is the rising sun. It takes intention, effort, humility, and its reward is great - eternal life.

I hope you can take advantage of the many ways of this Lenten season, and that it may be a time of renewal.
