Hello dear brothers and sisters,

On Saturday, January 21st, we will celebrate the Feast of Saint Agnes. St. Agnes died about 305. Historical accounts vary about the birth, life and manner of death of Agnes but generally it is recounted that, in order to preserve her virginity, she was martyred at a very young age, probably 12. Venerated in the Roman Canon, along with 6 other women (Felicity, Perpetua, Agatha, Lucy, Cecilia, and Anastasia) St. Agnes had made a personal vow of perpetual virginity and claimed Jesus as her only Spouse. However, many men were attracted to her and were angered at her refusal to marry them. Eventually, she was exposed as a Christian to the government and went joyfully to her martyrdom. Her body lies in Rome under the altar in St. Agnes Outside the Walls, while her skull is preserved in another Roman church - St. Agnes in Agony in the Piazza Navona. Because of the similarity of her name to the Latin for "lamb" (agnus), the lamb has been St. Agnes' symbol since the 6th century. On the feast day, the Trappist fathers of the Monastery of Tre Fontane (near Saint Paul's Basilica) provide two lambs from their sheepfold to the Benedictine nuns of Saint Cecilia. The lambs are brought to Saint Agnes' Basilica wearing crowns, lying in "baskets decorated with red and white flowers and red and white ribbons - red for martyrdom, white for purity. The two lambs are blessed by the Pope on the Feast of Saint Agnes. On Holy Thursday, these lambs are shorn, and their wool is used to create the pallium worn by each metropolitan Archbishop.

Probably you have noticed that when the archbishop celebrates Mass, he wears a pallium. The Pallium is a scarf, or stole-like vestment that is worn over the chasuble. It is about two inches wide, and it rests on the shoulders, with pendants or lappets that hang about 12 inches in the front and the back. When viewed from the front or the back, the pallium resembles the letter "Y." It is white, with six black crosses. Three of those crosses, the ones on the front, back and left shoulder, are ornamented with a gold pin, symbolizing the three nails of Christ's crucifixion. In addition, each of the pendants that hang in front and back are tipped with black satin, resembling the hoof of a lamb; thus the imagery being that of the archbishop, the chief shepherd of the diocese, carrying a lamb on his shoulders, in imitation of Christ the Good Shepherd. Originally, the pallium was worn only by the pope. The pope now gives it to metropolitan archbishops as a sign of their unity with him. Pope Benedict XVI said to the new Archbishops that the lamb's wool of the pallium "is meant to represent the lost, sick, or weak sheep which the shepherd places on his shoulders and carries to the waters of life" and reminds bishops to "be shepherds for unity and in unity - and that it is only in the unity represented by Peter that we truly lead people to Christ."

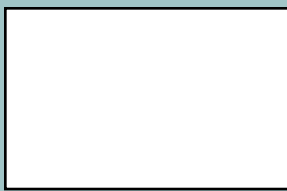

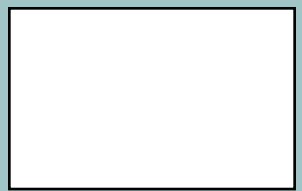
