

I love Holy Week! It is the week when we celebrate God's greatest sign of love, Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Passion. When we hear this word, most of us think first of deepest love; either love for another person or of the devotion to some beloved work/career. But the original meaning of the word is not love; it is suffering. This is why we speak of the suffering of Christ as His passion, and this is where we see the connection between the meanings of suffering and love: Christ was willing to suffer for us only because He loves us, and the depth of His love is revealed most fully in His Paschal Mystery.

During Holy Week we'll celebrate the last few days of Lent, the Sacred Paschal Triduum, and Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord. These are the holiest days of the year and the annual

celebration of the sacred mysteries through which we are saved from sin and death & restored to the glory of the children of God.

Today, on Palm Sunday we read together the account of Christ's final hours and the arrival of the Hour for which He came into the world. Together we shout: Crucify him! Crucify him! And look into the Holy Face expecting rejection and condemnation, and instead we find only forgiveness and infinite love.

On Tuesday of this Holy Week, many will gather with our Archbishop at the Cathedral Church of St. John the Evangelist in Milwaukee for the Chrism Mass. There he will bless the three Holy Oils that are used throughout the year in the celebration of the sacraments, the Holy Oils that will be used in all the parishes in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

On Holy Thursday of the Lord's Supper, we will celebrate a Solemn Mass in the evening to recall Christ's gifts to the Church of the Priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. Then the Most Blessed Sacrament will be carried to a place of repose, different from the tabernacle, and the altar will be stripped — signs of the impending grief to come.

On Good Friday of the Passion of the Lord, we will meditate on the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus as recorded in the Gospel according to St. John, and then we will adore the Holy Cross on which hung the salvation of the world.

Then, in the night of Holy Saturday, we will keep the Vigil of the Resurrection of the Lord, Easter Vigil. The whole plan of salvation will be unfolded in Holy Scripture, and the sacraments of Holy Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist will reveal the glory of the Risen Christ in our midst.

At Mass on Easter Sunday, all the baptized will renew the promises of their Baptism so that we may rededicate ourselves to follow Christ in the Holy Catholic Church.

I have great memories of Holy Week from my home city. Every day of Holy Week, beginning from Palm Sunday, the parishes come together to support the daily processions in Pamplona. Each day the procession goes from one parish to another along the city streets. Men from the Nazarene Fraternity of Pamplona (an organization like the Knights of Columbus) carry on their shoulders the heavy life-size figures that represent scenes from the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. People stand in the sidewalks to see the procession goes by, which from beginning to end last over an hour. Parents use the processions as a teaching tool of the Paschal Mystery. However, what I love the most about Holy Week are the different liturgies, especially of the Sacred Triduum. I cannot find words to describe how much I love the Holy Week liturgies.

As Lent draws to a close, I invite you to participate in the Sacred Triduum Masses and Liturgies that help us to focus on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

Holy Week and Easter should not be business as usual. If we believe that Jesus came to die for us and for our salvation, we need to put time aside to pray to and worship Him. From an eternal life perspective, what else can be more important? We can most fully appreciate and experience the joy of the Resurrection by participating in and meditating on the Passion and Death of the Lord.

My hope and prayer is that this week may truly be a holy one for all of you!




