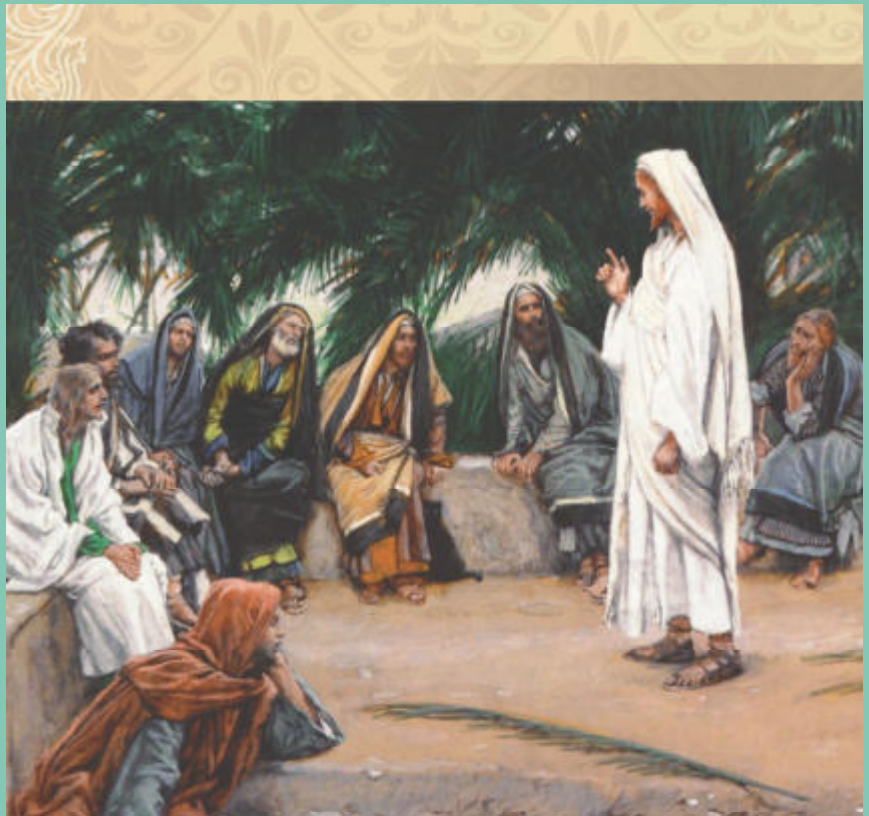

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER BRIAN

Last week in our second reading (I Corinthians 15:1-11) we heard Saint Paul's account of the Resurrection of Christ. It is the oldest written account we have of what happened on Easter Sunday. Saint Paul the Apostle was not among the disciples to whom Jesus first appeared on Easter Sunday, as Paul himself admits in verse 8: "Last of all, as to one born abnormally, he appeared to me." "Abnormally" or not, Jesus did appear to Paul (then known as Saul of Tarsus) on the road to Damascus and the rest, as they say, is history. Like he did for the rest of the apostles, Jesus gave Paul a mission. Paul would use his talents, skills (especially foreign language skills) and energy to preach the gospel to all nations.

I find it very intriguing how many men and women Paul enlists to be his co-workers in this effort. He mentions many of these co-workers by name in his letters. In his letter to the Church at Roman, for example, Saint Paul mentions by name and with gratitude more than thirty individuals who were his friends and co-workers: Phoebe, Prisca, Aquila, Epaphroditus, Mary, Andronicus, Junia, Ampliatus, Urbanus, Stachys, Apelles, Aristobulus, Herodion, Narcissus, Tryphaena, Tryphosa, Rufus, Asyncritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas, Hermas, Philologus, Julia, Nereus, Olympas, Timothy, Lucius, Jason, Sosipater, Tertius, Gaius, Erastus and Quartus. We can see that from the very beginning the Church has relied on the collaborative efforts of many individuals to accomplish its mission. The mission of Jesus himself and the willingness of Christians to pitch in and work with others continues to this very day.

Next weekend our Stewardship Commission will share with us various ways in which all of us can embrace Christian discipleship in new ways. We are trying our best to find effective ways to allow parish members to share their time and talents here at Saint Charles Borromeo Church. A beautiful brochure has been prepared for you to see what kinds of help we need and allow you to consider ways in which you can contribute your own time and talent and energies to the work of Saint Charles Borromeo Parish. We can add our own names to the list begun by Paul so long ago. I thank all of you for your ongoing support. I am edified by your generosity and kindness!



Love without Limits

A major portion of the Human Concerns Commission at St. Charles Borromeo Parish is the Bereavement Ministry which provides service to families and friends who have lost a loved one.

These dedicated volunteers serve as greeters for Funeral Vigils and Masses held here at St. Charles Borromeo. They help visitors find their way in our parish and sometimes assist people during vigils in the Gathering Space. They also help out when Eucharistic Ministers, Mass servers, and lectors are needed during a Mass of Christian Burial.

Bereavement Ministers also contact the next-of-kin to express our condolences. This is done before the funeral and after the funeral to express our support.

Each November, a Bereavement Mass is held for those who lost a loved one in the preceding year. This Mass is usually held in conjunction with All Souls Day. A reception is held afterward in the Gathering Space.

The Bereavement Ministry provides necessary services for those who have experienced a death of a loved one. This group combines compassion with service to support those in their time of need.

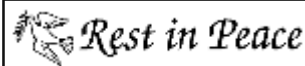
