CYF, YOUTH MINISTRY AND MORE

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER BRIAN HOLBUS

A blessed and Happy Pentecost Sunday to all of you! This day marks the conclusion of the Easter season and the birthday of the Church. It is a great feast for us as spring transitions to summer.

The month of June marks the end of another school year and another fiscal year for our parishes. It is also a time when parishes experience transitions in their human resources. Staff members retire or move on to new positions elsewhere. The parishes of Saint Roman and Saint Charles Borromeo bid farewell to **Father Norberto José Sandoval Villalobos** as he departs for three parishes in Sheboygan on June 18, 2019. On the same day we welcome **Father Carlos Alberto Zapata Muñoz** who is transferring from three parishes in Racine and Walworth County.

Our two parishes are also experiencing changes in our ministries of Christian Formation. After twenty-four years of faithful and generous service to Saint Charles Borromeo parish, **Catherine Krol** has decided to retire from her position as Director of Christian Formation. Since our two parishes had already been collaborating before I became the pastor of Saint Roman in 2009, I have been very blessed to work with Cathy Krol in our shared parish missions and RCIA ministries for a decade. My admiration and appreciation for Cathy Krol and her dedicated ministry increased exponentially when I became the shared pastor of Saint Roman and Saint Charles Borromeo in June of 2016. Thank you, Cathy Krol, for your tireless efforts to share the faith of our church with so many young people and in so many innovative ways!

Lety Gutiérrez-Kenny, our Shared Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry, has also decided to take a position at a nearby parish with a schedule that allows her more easily to work and to care for her two young children at home. I am grateful for Lety's capable and generous work in this ministry as well. Thank you, Lety, and many blessings to you in your future work!

These transitions in personnel have prompted us to consider our current needs as individual parishes with many shared ministries and programs. Our demographics keep changing, as we all know. How can we best configure our human resources—parish volunteers and paid personnel—and our financial resources to provide the very best Christian Formation for our children, teenagers, young adults and older adults at this moment in our history?

Saint Roman and Saint Charles Borromeo are two parishes that share a pastor and an associate pastor. We have separate Finance Councils and Pastoral Councils and separate finances. We have carefully designed formulae to ensure that both parishes share the expenses of shared ministry in an equitable manner. Our Finance Councils oversee our respective budgets to make sure our monies are collected and spent appropriately. Both parishes are proud to support vibrant parochial schools under the auspices of Seton Catholic Schools. Even though our parishes are structured and staffed very differently than when I was growing up in the 1960s, the mission remains the same. I am very proud and happy to be a priest and pastor during these decades of renewal following the Second Vatican Council.

One of the keys to success in Catholic ministry in this era is **collaboration**, the ability and the willingness to **work together** to achieve a common goal.

Collaboration has been a guiding principle for my thirty-eight years of priesthood and continues to be an impetus to my work as your shared pastor. In the spirit of collaboration, I asked the Personnel Committees of both parishes to have a joint meeting to consider our present situation, especially at this time of transition in the area of Christian Formation. We met twice during an already very busy time of year and examined carefully the numbers of children and teenagers in our programs of Christian Formation. We considered various ways to reconfigure our financial and human resources to meet the needs of all most effectively and most efficiently.

Saint Charles Borromeo will hire someone to replace Catherine Krol as Director of Christian Formation. Betty Salazar will continue to serve as the Director of Christian Formation at Saint Roman parish. Both Directors of Christian Formation will rely on part-time persons to help to relieve the administrative portions of their work so that they can concentrate on the actual ministry. Cathy Krol will continue to work part-time during this transition to provide continuity and reassurance to all.

This ministry will become even more collaborative as we move forward, since the position of Director of Youth and Young Adult ministry will be absorbed into the roles of our two Directors of Christian Formation. The programs of catechesis and sacramental formation will also be more collaborative, even as we maintain the connection of all of our children and young persons to our respective parishes.



Cont. Page 1: People sometimes become alarmed by words like “collaboration” and “shared” anything. We fear the loss of the spiritual home and hearth that each parish represents for our parishioners. As someone who has spent almost four decades working collaboratively in five different parishes and their parochial schools, two Catholic high schools, Hispanic ministry, jail ministry and ministry to the deaf and hard-of-hearing I see our present reconfiguring of ministries and resources as an exciting opportunity to truly work together to advance the mission of our beloved Roman Catholic Church. Please pay close attention as you receive more information about these shared ministries and pray for the success of our common endeavors.

Come, Holy Spirit! Fill the hearts of your faithful! Enkindle within us the fire of your love!

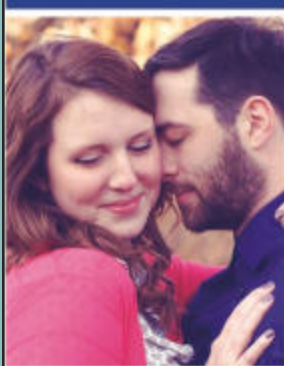
