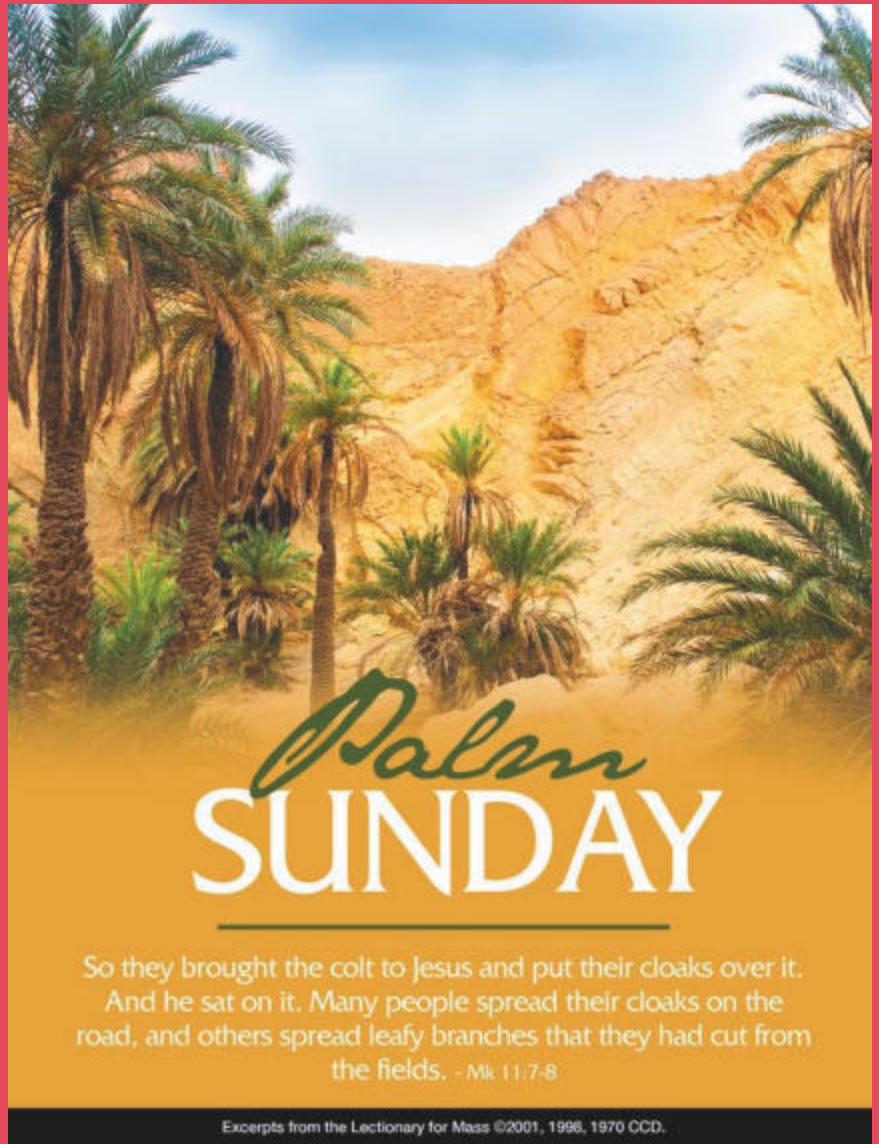

In April registrations will be open for next year. For more information please call parish office or check parish website.



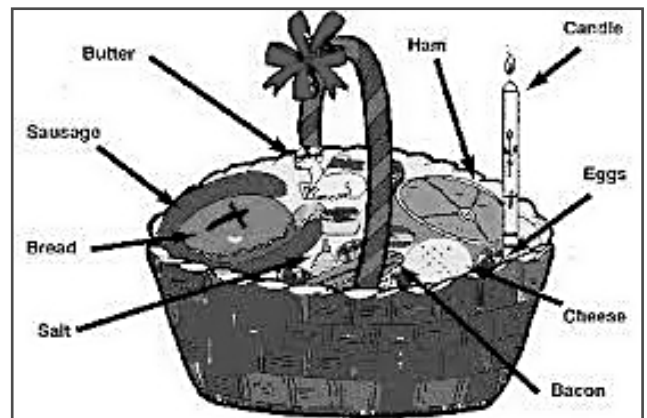
### Holy Thursday Collections

### Swieconka – Polish Blessing of the Baskets

Easter Saturday Swieconka (sh-vee-en-soon-kah) is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions. Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin and decorated with sprigs of boxwood (bukszpan), the typical Easter evergreen. Poles take special pride in preparing a decorative and tasteful basket with crisp linens, occasionally embroidered for the occasion, and just enough boxwood and ribbon woven through the handle. Observing the beautiful foods and creations of other parishioners is one of the special joys of the event. While in some older or rural communities, the priest visits the home to bless the foods, the vast majority of Poles and Polish parishioners visit the church on Holy Saturday.

### *What is the Chrism Mass?*

The Chrism Mass takes place each year on Tuesday of Holy Week. There is a significant beauty to this celebration, as the Church unites for the blessing of the oils and the consecration of the chrism. These oils are then used throughout the archdiocese in the administration of sacraments.

*Sacred Chrism* is a mixture of olive oil and balsam, an aromatic resin. This oil is linked with the sanctification of individuals. In the Old Testament times, the priests, prophets and kings of the Jewish people were anointed. This oil is used in the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and holy orders.

*Oil of Catechumens* is used in connection with the sacrament of baptism. The priest anoints the person to be baptized on the chest, saying, "We anoint you with the oil of salvation in the name of Christ our Savior; may He strengthen you with His power, Who lives and reigns forever and ever."

*Oil of the Infirm* is used in the sacrament of the anointing of the sick (formerly known as extreme unction). St. James wrote, "Is there anyone sick among you? He should ask for the priests of the Church. They in turn are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. This prayer uttered in faith will reclaim the one who is ill, and the Lord will restore him to health. If he has committed any sins, forgiveness will be his" (Jas 5:14-15).

As the bishop blesses these three oils at the Chrism Mass this year, our hearts turn to our gracious Lord who bestows His infinite love and mercy to us through these sacraments. Let us also pray for our bishop and the priests who are the ministers of the sacraments in the parish, that they may be the humble and generous servants of the Lord.
