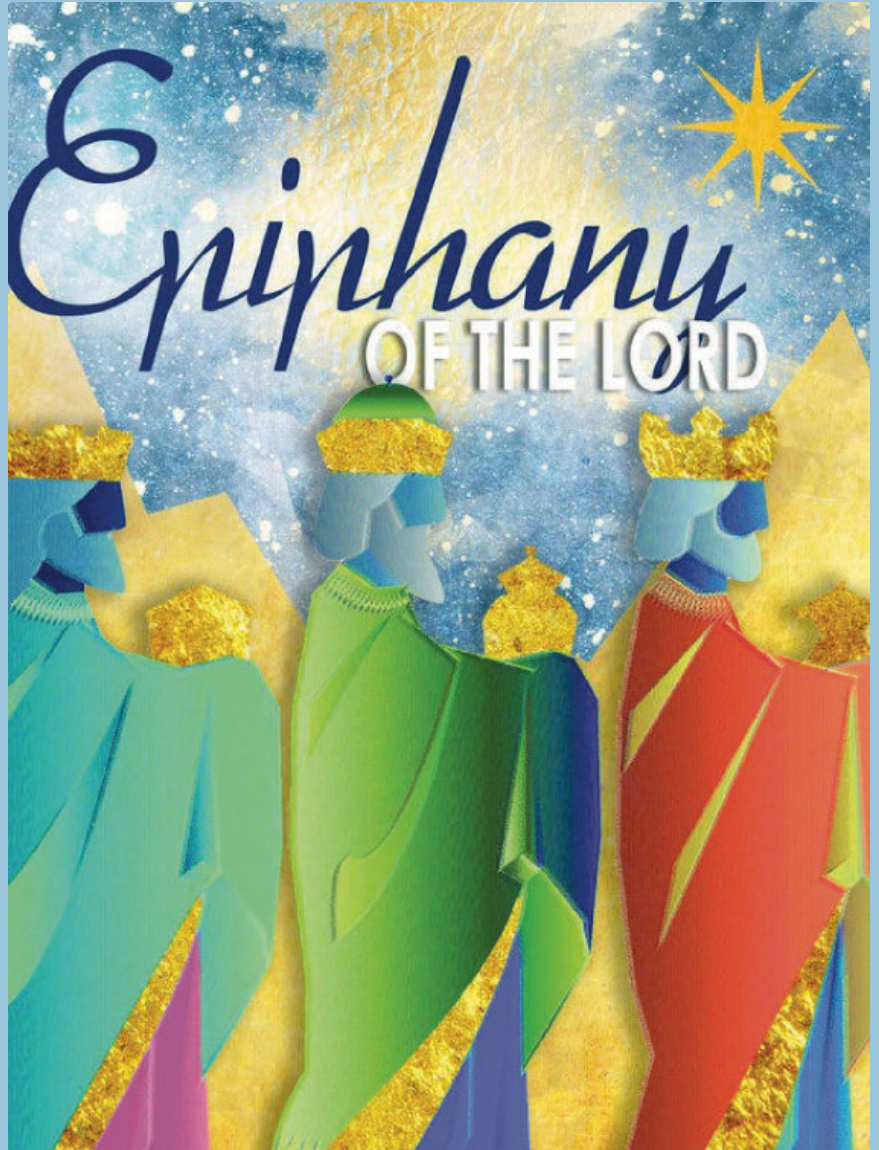

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, namesake of the Catholic schools network in Milwaukee, was born in 1774. She is the first native-born American to be canonized.



Elizabeth was born into an upper class family in New York and raised Episcopalian. Her mother died when Elizabeth was 3. She married in 1794 and had 5 children. She often cared for sick and dying family, friends and neighbors in need.

After her husband's death, she decided to become Catholic. She officially joined the Church in 1805. Eventually moving to Maryland, she took her vows in 1809 and was then known as Mother Seton. She established St. Joseph's academy and Free School, dedicated to the education of girls, in 1810.

Mother Seton died in 1821 at the age of 46. She was canonized on September 14, 1975, by Pope Paul VI. Her feast day is January 4. *St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, pray for us and our schools.*

Reflection on the Epiphany of the Lord

On entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Matthew 2:11

“Epiphany” means manifestation. The “Epiphany of the Lord” is Jesus’ manifestation not only to these three Magi from the East, but it’s also a symbolic but real manifestation of the Christ to the whole world. These Magi reveal that Jesus came for all people and all are called to adore Him. These Magi were “wise men” who studied the stars and were aware of the Jewish belief that a Messiah was coming. They would have been versed in much of the wisdom of the day and would have been intrigued by the Jewish belief in the Messiah.

God used what they were familiar with to call them to adore the Christ. He used a star. They understood the stars and when they saw this new and unique star over Bethlehem they realized that something special was happening. So the first lesson we take from this for our own lives is that God will use what is familiar to us to call us to Himself. Look for the “star” that God is using to call you. It’s closer than you may think.
