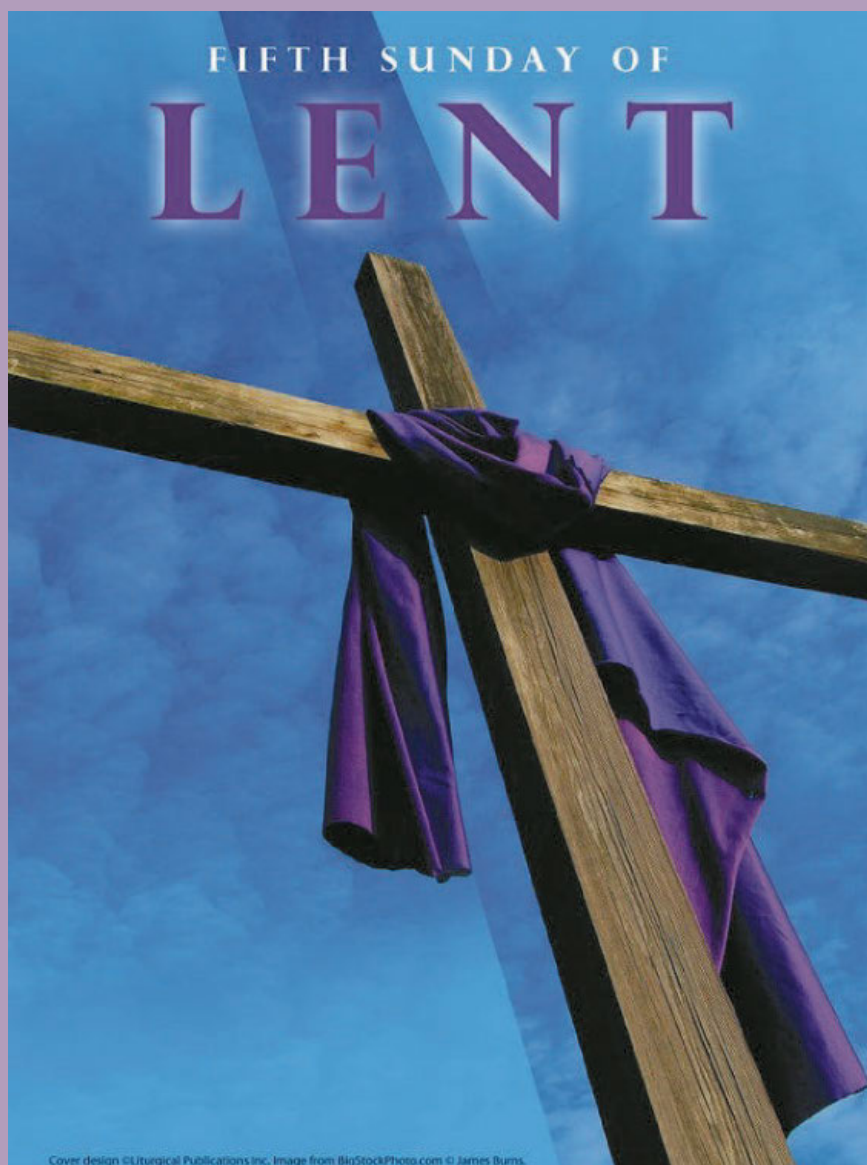

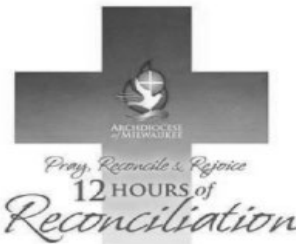

HUMAN CONCERNS

Café Sunday Sponsored by Human Concerns

Please join us April 6 in the Gathering Space after both Masses for coffee and fellowship. This month, Café Sunday will be sponsored by the Human Concerns Commission which is involved in outreach efforts to the St. Charles faith community and beyond. This outreach can be characterized by the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. There are a number of Ministries within this Commission.

The Bereavement Ministry members provides support at visitations and funeral Masses. They keep in touch for one year via cards, phone calls and sometimes home visits. Loved ones are celebrated at an annual special Mass of Remembrance on All Souls' Day.

Eucharistic Ministers to the Homebound bring the Eucharist to members who cannot attend Mass. Eucharistic Ministers to St. Luke's, along with Ministers from St. Mary's Hales Corners, bring Jesus in the Eucharist to those hospitalized at St. Luke's on the third Sunday of every month.

Our Prayer Shawl Ministers create beautiful shawls that are prayed over during their creation and blessed for the recipient. Prayer shawls can be worked on at home as well as during the monthly meeting. If you would like a prayer shawl, contact Juana at the Parish Office.

St. Charles Prayer Chain Ministry, consisting of 35-45 members, is a spiritual ministry where members pray daily to intercede on behalf of others in times of emergency or special needs. Ministers are notified via email or phone of the intentions that are requested. We pray for a full week for each intention.
