## The Psalm Post

### Psalm 107:1-2 Prayer of the Redeemed

“Give thanks to the Lord for he is good,  
his mercy endures forever!”

Let that be the prayer of the Lord's redeemed,  
those redeemed from the hand of the foe.

Psalm 107:1-2

Psalm 107:1-2 is an invitation for everyone who has been saved, redeemed, rescued by the hand of God to offer praise and thanksgiving to God whose mercy endures forever. An example of a divine rescue is described in Mark 4:35-41, “Jesus Calms the Storm at Sea.” On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples, “Let us cross to the other side.” Jesus and his disciples took more than a boat ride across the lake that day. They took a mystical journey of faith with Jesus. The disciples began the crossing with their friend and teacher, Jesus, but they ended the crossing with Jesus, the Son of God. In the midst of the storm the disciples encountered Jesus, the Lord, who calmed the sea and their fears. The disciples began to see who Jesus was and their faith increased as they were filled with wonder.

The disciples were rescued, redeemed, by the saving hand of God. All people who have been saved by God are invited to give thanks and praise to God, whose mercy endures forever. While not everyone has had a dramatic divine rescue, everyone has benefited from God's mercy. Have your fears and anxieties been calmed by your faith?

**Changes to Weekend Mass Gatherings**

St. Catherine is carefully following the data by slowly making changes to our Mass gatherings. Beginning this week, June 19 and 20, these are the changes we have made for both your safety and convenience.

---The north side of the church will be completely open with those not concerned with social distancing or mask-wearing.

---The south side remains as is, for those wishing to keep the six-foot separation with or without masks.

---The choir loft and Granville Room protocols remain the same for those wishing to keep the six-foot separation with or without masks.

---Ushers no longer need to seat people unless they wish the social distance.

---The ushers will also no longer need to conduct dismissal. People are free to exit however they wish.

---The Orders of Worship can be dropped off as you exit or can be taken home and then brought back for the following weekend. They are good for several weeks.

---At the end of Mass, the ushers can distribute bulletins with or without gloves and masks, at their discretion.

# LITURGY NOTES

**12th Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**June 19/20, 2021**  
**The Puzzling Identity of Jesus**



*"Peace! Be Still"*  
Mark 4:39

Mark constructs his narrative of this storm-stilling incident so as to climax in the disciples' perplexed questioning of Jesus' identity. The passage gives no direct answer. The present action recall's God's authority over the unformed waters of creation in Genesis. Jesus is the very power of God.

There is no storm in life, however rough the winds of it for us, in which Jesus is not with us in it, not there to save us from its power.

*It started out as a simple boat ride. But it turned into a stormy trip which threatened the lives of the disciples.*

*Isn't that the way it often is, Lord?*

*Even the simplest plans can become complicated.*

*The disciples do not have a monopoly on fear and trembling.*

*We have been there, Lord!*

*We meet fear and trembling frequently as we move through life.*

*Fears even reside in our subconscious waiting for the opportunity to surface.*

*To all of this, Jesus says "Peace! Be still!"*

*When we experience fear for any reason, it is important to remember who is in charge of this universe.*

*You are, Lord, And when you say, "Peace! Be still!"*

*It happens!*

*All we have to do is listen and believe. Amen.*
