## Family Life

Like many of us, I was anxious to turn the calendar to 2021. 2020 has led us on a long, sometime painful journey. We have all been forced to adjust our day to day habits and reevaluate our priorities. One of the common things that I hear from people is they really miss church. Now, I don't think that they necessarily mean the physical building, but what 'doing church' means to us. Reflect on what does St. James mean to you? What is God's plan for the St. James community?

As I reflect back on the blessings of 2020, I have grown to appreciate time. I've learned to slow down and live in the present. I can't control tomorrow and the past is gone. One of my friends has used her "shelter in place time" to put her closets and rooms in order. She says that she feels so much more relaxed now that things are in order. God wants us to have order in our lives. God gives us the rhythms of the seasons. The Church gives us the rhythms of the Liturgical Calendar. Within the Liturgical Calendar are two cycle of readings. The Catholic Lectionary includes a two-year cycle of readings (appropriately called Cycle I -the odd numbered years and Cycle II-the even numbered years). The Sunday readings follow a three-year cycle, designated as A, B and C. The liturgical year started on the first Sunday of Advent, so we are currently in Year B. Most of our Sunday gospel readings will come from Mark. You can read the daily readings by subscribing to [USCCB.org/daily-bible-reading](http://USCCB.org/daily-bible-reading). You will have read most of the entire bible in three years.

New Year 2021 is the perfect time to set some faith filled resolutions. Instead of dusting off the treadmill, dust off the bible and your rosary and commit to making 2021 a year of spiritual improvement. As an individual:

Commit to going to confession more often

Go to daily Mass once a week

Spend an hour in Adoration

Start a prayer journal and keep track of all of the people you are praying for

Pray the rosary daily. Relevant Radio prays the rosary live every evening at 7 PM

As a couple:

Read the daily Mass readings together

Bless each other as you leave for your day

Pray together at night

Form or join a small faith sharing group

As a parent

Keep Sunday for God - attend Mass together. The sacraments keep us connected to God.

Feature religious art in your home. This serves as a physical reminder of the elements of our faith

Pray the rosary as a family

THIS is stewardship in action. When we all come together, we truly can make a difference in the world!!

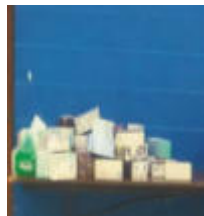
Because of our work, many people will have hope and joy this holiday season, and beyond. This is what Christ asks of us.

## OUR CHALLENGES

St. James saw a 9.9% decrease in collections in 2019-20, primarily due to no Masses from March to May, or ones with very limited attendance in June. Sadly, Covid-19 caused the cancellation of the annual parish festival and car raffle, its main fund raisers. An ongoing collection to offset fundraising losses will be ongoing through June 2021.

## OUR BLESSINGS

Despite these challenges, we are able to reach out to many, thanks in large part to the efforts of our Technology Ministry and other volunteers who help us bring Jesus to people in new ways. Almost immediately when the statewide shutdown was mandated in March, we started to broadcast and live stream our Masses through both YouTube and the St. James Facebook page. Parish leadership implemented sanitizing procedures, social distancing, mask wearing, and changes to receiving Communion. We began providing overflow seating in the Activity Center and radio broadcasts to hear Mass while remaining in one's vehicle in our parking lots. We also initiated a telephone outreach effort for every registered parish household, offering hope and encouragement.

Our parish has been blessed with many generous, committed disciples of Christ. FY 2019-20 ended with a net surplus of \$14,101, mainly due to a 3.15% decrease in expenses, totaling \$27,114. With these resources, we were able to provide faith formation opportunities and experiences to almost 300 youth in 2019-20. A group of dedicated catechists work with our staff to bring virtual faith formation opportunities to our youth for the 2020-21 school year. We hired a part-time Youth Activities Coordinator, shared as part of a collaboration with St. Theresa Parish. We offered bible studies and faith sharing opportunities to all our parishioners. Three members went through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, and were either baptized or received into the Catholic faith from another denomination. A collaborative GriefShare ministry was started with parishioners from both parishes.

We celebrated 156 Sunday and 104 weekday Masses, as well as 96 Communion services at two local nursing facilities. We found safe, creative ways to celebrate the sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation. 8 couples were united in Holy Matrimony and 25 funerals helped to comfort grieving families and friends. Despite Covid-19, 41 individuals received the Anointing of the Sick. We were fortunate enough to receive \$98,984 from the Payroll Protection Program that was enacted to help non-profits and small businesses stay afloat during the current coronavirus-induced economic crunch. Father Loyola and the parish leadership have continued to meet and oversee day-to-day parish operations in new and safe ways, thanks to their willingness to use the technologies of Zoom, web cams, smart phones and tablets.

We are looking forward to celebrating the parish's 125th anniversary with you on February 28, 2021! Thank you for all your support and patience during these very trying times. May God bless all of you and keep you safe from harm.
