## Reconciliation

St. James and St. Theresa parishes invite you to our Fall Reconciliation day.

We are using the theme of Jesus' healing touch for this special day. Jesus heals a woman who has been suffering with a bleeding disorder in the Gospels of Matthew, chapter 9, Mark, chapter 5 and Luke, chapter 8. She has visited many doctors and healings seeking relief. She has likely spent a fortune looking for a miracle cure. She has been labeled "unclean" because bleeding was a social taboo in first century Israel. She is finally reaching out to Jesus, the healer, as a last resort. The healing of this woman is something we can all relate to.

Healing does not always happen as we expect it. It does not always resemble physical restoration. We can ask ourselves: "What is the difference between being healed and being cured"? A cure is a transformation in the body, a body that will eventually die and deteriorate. Healing takes place in a much deeper place. It is the emotional and psychological acceptance and trust in God. It is a transformation in the person's life, where they are able to integrate into community, find meaning in life and grow closer to Jesus.

The woman boldly touches the tassel of Jesus cloak. She trusts that Jesus healing power will be transmitted to her through that touch because she already believes that He is the Messiah. Jesus senses the touch and reaches out to her. He says, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace". She has been healed.

Come experience the healing power of Jesus' touch through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We are offering Reconciliation on Wednesday, September 15<sup>th</sup> from 9-11 AM and 6-8 PM at St. James. There will be multiple priests available, social distancing and Covid cleaning protocols in place. You do not need to sign up, come anytime during the above hours. This is the third Reconciliation Day we have offered at St. James this year. We have enclosed a card to help you prepare.

## GriefShare

The GriefShare Ministry at St. James and St. Theresa is looking to expand our meeting times. We need additional facilitators. Grief Share is a support program that helps and encourages people after the death of a



spouse, child, family member or friend. The program is non-denominational and features biblical concepts for healing from grief. The group is not a counseling session. The group meets weekly and consists of a video seminar, support group discussion and a workbook for journaling and personal study exercises. Are you a good communicator? Are you confidential? Finally, are you teachable? These are all characteristics of great facilitators.

## Human Concerns



For the past year, the Human Concerns committees of St. Theresa and St. James have studied systemic racism using resources suggested by the USCCB document "Open Wide our Hearts". They read and studied the document as a group and led a prayer for Unity at a Mass last November. As a conclusion to the year of study, they are hosting a Prayer Service and panel discussion on Thursday, September 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM at

St. Theresa, which is the feast day for St. Peter Claver. St. Peter Claver is the patron saint of Interracial injustice. He was a Jesuit priest who traveled to Colombia to work as a missionary. He dedicated his life to working with the slaves who were brought to the Americas. He brought them food, water and clothing and taught them about Jesus Christ. He encouraged people to treat them with dignity and respect. St. Peter Claver is also the name of our sister parish in Belize.

Please join the Human Concerns committee at St. Theresa as we pray for an end to racism and violence in our country and the world. Like St. Peter Claver, we too are called to act with mercy and treat each other with dignity and respect. We are called by virtue of our baptism to work for the rights all people.

### 33-day Consecration to St. Joseph



What does it mean for a person to be consecrated to St. Joseph? It simply means that you acknowledge St. Joseph as your spiritual father and you want to use his life choices as an example. You entrust yourself entirely into his paternal care. Total consecration to St. Joseph means you make a formal act of filial

entrustment to your spiritual father so that he can take care of your spiritual well-being and lead you to God.

Pope Francis announced that 2021 would be dedicated to St. Joseph. Archbishop ListECKI has asked us to plan an event to celebrate St. Joseph this year. Prayer and Worship and Adult Faith Formation has planned a Holy Hour to St. Joseph on October 24, 2021 at 2:00 PM at St. Theresa Church. Deacon Anton will be presiding. The Holy hour consists of prayers honoring St. Joseph, Benediction and Adoration.

To prepare for this Holy Hour, we recommend reading Fr. Don Calloway's Book "Consecration to St. Joseph The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father". Fr. Calloway draws upon the long tradition of devotion to St. Joseph and invites us to consecrate ourselves to St. Joseph, to grow in devoted love of him and invoke his protection for the Church. You can complete the 33-day consecration prior to October 24<sup>th</sup> by starting the book on **Wednesday, September 22, 2021.**
