FOR THE RIDE HOME ~ DO WHATEVER HE **TELLS YOU**

Today's Gospel was one of the first Gospels that I can recall from my childhood. It is a Gospel that is very familiar to all of us as it tells the story of a wedding, Jesus, His mother Mary and his first miracle! We are especially connected as this Gospel points to our marriage with God so it is fitting that the first sign of who Jesus is occurs at a wedding.

Today on your ride home, take a few minutes to talk with your family or reflect quietly on what Mary says to the servants - DO WHATEVER HE TELLS YOU. As well as talking about the story from John's Gospel, think of it in terms of all that lesus tells us to do. What are some of those things? lesus tells us:

Love the Lord your God with all your heart ~ What can we transform in our life to do whatever Jesus tells us to do? Pray more, attend Mass more

often, receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation regularly, make God the priority ...

Love your neighbor as yourself ~ What can we transform in our life to do whatever Jesus tells us to do? Bring extra food on the We Share weekend, help at homeless shelters, sacrifice something and give the money to those less fortunate...

Come, follow me and I will make you fishers of men ~ What can we transform in our life to do whatever Jesus tells us to do? Invite someone you know who hasn't been to Mass in a while to come with you, invite a new neighbor to join us at one of our events, be brave in your faith...

Do this in remembrance of me ~ What can we transform in our life to do whatever Jesus asks us to do? During the Eucharistic prayer, pray reverently with Father as he prays aloud, pay special attention during the sacred Eucharistic prayer when Father calls down the Holy Spirit and consecration occurs, receive the Body of Christ and carry it out into the world with you by your actions and words...

This week, remember that we are always at a wedding feast ~ that Mary has asked us, as servants, to do whatever He tells us to do at our daily celebrations. We are called to transform the ordinary into the extraordinary so that the world can see the true Jesus through our actions.
