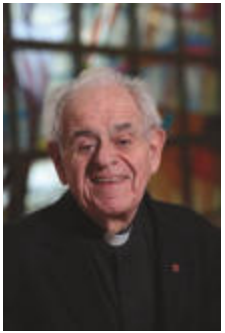

TO FELLOW DISCIPLES OF OUR LORD JESUS:

COMMON SENSE AND GOSPEL OF JESUS SENSE.

Many say that “COMMON SENSE” is not so common. So many people do not seem to have any. WHY? There are probably as many reasons as there are folks without it, but one overarching theme seems to be that we are formed by our past experiences and how we are taught to deal with them. I often comment that two people can have identical things happen to them and each deals with this “happening” in totally different ways. My example is “road rage.” You get cut off in traffic. What is your reaction? One person gets so irritated that he resorts to some form of violence. The next person just smiles, relaxes and let it bounce off his mind. Why the difference in reaction? I am firmly convinced that our reactions are the decisions we have made about how to react to the happenstances of life. I admit that these decisions are oftentimes unconscious, but they are our choices. We decide for ourselves how we are going to react in any given circumstance. The best story about this is the set of twins—one an optimist and the other a pessimist (if you don’t know the story, let me know and I will finish it for you).

Now Jesus comes along and gives us an even deeper SENSE---I like to call it the GOSPEL SENSE. Jesus is constantly challenging us, as His disciples, to follow His teachings—which is to follow His example. In the example of the road rage above, Jesus tells us not only do NOT seek to get even or to get revenge on the other driver, but also do not just smile and let it bounce off your mind, BUT also LOVE that reckless, thoughtless, dangerous driver. This means that we should pray for her/him and even go out of our way to do something nice for them. Why not just slow down and let them go first? Let the other person go ahead of you in line. Jesus teaches us that we are not the center of the universe and our way is not the only way.

Jesus says, “Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. Turn the other cheek. Give to one who begs.” (Luke 6)

WHY? Because that is the way God treats US. Unless we realize this and accept this in our minds and hearts, we can never ever live His way. This is GOSPEL SENSE.
