# WELCOME TO ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON

## HAPPY NEW YEAR!!

Most people in our secular society think of the beginning of the NEW YEAR as January 1. This, of course, is the beginning of the calendar year. However, we Christians celebrate the beginning of the year with the First Sunday of Advent. We call this the beginning of our liturgical (prayer) year. It would be somewhat interesting to take a survey to see how many people think of the beginning of the year as this First Sunday of Advent or think first of January 1. That would be a true sign of the orientation of our lives—whether we direct our lives by the activities of Jesus or by the pull of our secular world. Please think about how we would judge ourselves by our answer to this question.



Now is the season of ADVENT. How do you view this month of December? Again most people immediately think about Christmas and all the activities they feel are necessary. This year, of course, many things are changed because of the pandemic, but there are many things that we still want to do; things like decorating, shopping for presents, cooking and baking, cleaning, sending cards/greetings, maybe even traveling or arranging virtual get-togethers with family and friends to mention just a few.

Please reflect with me about ADVENT. What is the real purpose we celebrate this time? Of course it is to prepare for the birth of Jesus of Nazareth whom we accept and believe as the presence of our Savior and God. Now reflect with me to think about all the things we feel we have to do before Christmas. Do these really help us prepare for the coming of Christ Jesus, especially His coming into our hearts and lives? Do these really help transform us so that we could be greater examples of His presence and attitude and action in our daily lives?

I remind myself and others to go back to the basics. First think about ADVENT and the real purpose we spend this time (usually about 4 weeks). Again the real “reason for the season” is that Christ would be more and more a part of our lives; that Christ would grow more and more IN us and THROUGH us. With that foundation, decide what activities would help. Choose to do those things only, and stop doing all the rest. If decorating helps put you in the “mood” then, of course, do the decorating. But if this just leads to frustration or even worse, being upset and even angry, then PLEASE do not decorate. And you can take any of the tasks you feel are “necessary” to prepare for Christmas and analyze them in the same way. If they help you open your heart and life to the greater presence of Christ---unselfish love and peace and charity—then of course, PLEASE do this or that. But if they do NOT lead to greater peace and love, then for heaven’s sake, don’t feel pressured to do them. And especially, do not do these because everyone else is doing them. This is good old peer pressure and we Christians should have outgrown this when we matured (or maybe we haven’t

matured as Christians yet)!

Please remember what ADVENT is really all about, and do something to help prepare yourself for the greater coming of our Lord Jesus into your life, and through you, into our society. Again, I repeat, do something but don’t feel like you have to do everything. Then as Christmas day winds to a close, you won’t say, “Thank the Lord it is over” but you will say, “I am really glad I had this time to let the Lord into my life.”

## CATHOLIC COMEBACK TO WEEKEND WORSHIP: SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION DURING THIS COVID-19 PANDEMIC:

Archbishop ListECKI wants to communicate that there are reasons to excuse ourselves from this obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

1. When it is impossible to attend Mass—for example: you are traveling, bad weather or your need to work.
2. If you are ill or are caring for a person who is ill or taking care of someone who needs your company and attention.
3. If you are at risk of becoming ill due to underlying medical conditions or have a compromised immune system.
4. If you are genuinely afraid of becoming sick because of risk factors, such as a pre-existing condition, age or a compromised immune system.

It is up to each individual to weigh one’s own circumstances and use good conscience.

PLEASE REMEMBER, if you are uncomfortable for any reason, involving the virus and your health, especially being present for a long period with a large gathering of people at Mass, please excuse yourself. This is not a sin; do not feel any guilt or sin.

A well-formed conscience is upright and truthful. I hope this is helpful.

**Please note: Also, we are livestreaming each Mass into Sippel Hall. This gives everyone more space and distancing for worship. Communion Ministers bring the Eucharist into Sippel Hall so that everyone may receive Holy Communion.**


