TO FELLOW DISCIPLES OF OUR LORD JESUS:



I know that I am repeating myself but the more I study and reflect on the

events in the Bible, the more it seems that this Word of God is not just about people who lived a long time ago but it is also about all of us today. That is why the Word of God is timeless. The reason for this is that human nature doesn't change over the centuries. We are all created with the same basic substance of needs, wants and desires. I admit that we have to dig a little deeper into each situation to see how it might include us. And I also admit that not every passage has a deeper message.

The first reading this weekend is from the Book of Exodus and is about the Jewish people in the desert after fleeing out of their slavery in Egypt. For me this event has two basic elements that affect most of us.

1. COMPLAINING! Don't we all complain? For most of us, there is always something that is not right or good enough for us. I come from a farming background and if you ever noticed, farmers are always complaining. If there is not enough rain, the farmers will complain about the scarcity of the harvest. If there is enough rain (and God forbid too much rain), the farmers will complain that their barns are not big enough to hold all the harvest. See what I mean? There is an old barbershop harmony song that says, "These will be the good old days twenty years from now!" Why do I always think about the good old days? It is because we forget the pain and hardships of the past. The Jewish people complained to Moses because they did not have enough food and water in the desert, and they remembered the good food in Egypt, but they forgot the harsh slavery they had to endure there. So the Word of God says, "Stop complaining and think about the blessings we all have right now!" Oh it might not be everything we need or want but it certainly is enough.

2. OUR BLESSINGS ARE RIGHT IN FRONT OF

US! Again the Jews in the desert were complaining that they didn't have any food, but the manna was there, right in front of them on the desert flood, but they didn't realize or see it. It was not evident to them until Moses explained what it was---food for their journey. It wasn't what they were looking for or what they expected. So it is with us. Our blessings are right in front of us and so often we do not

recognize them. WHY? Because they are not what we expected them to be? We always dream of things to be a certain way and most of the time they are not. We always want everything and everyone to be perfect. And most of the time it is not. Some people want a perfect spouse so they divorce their mate for another, only to find out the new one is not so perfect as they had expected. Sometimes they even want the old one back. You expect your kids to be perfect and they are not and perhaps, at times, you would prefer to have your neighbors' kids-only to find out they are not so perfect as they seem to be. Your blessings are not out there somewhere in the future. They are right in front of you. Even though not perfect, they are a blessing Thank God for them. Don't look for something better when you have the ones that are pretty good right there. If any of this seems familiar to you, you have just lived a page or two out of the Bible and again, it was not just about people who lived centuries ago but people who live today -you and me.


