#### TO FELLOW DISCIPLES OF OUR LORD JESUS: FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY:



Part of our problem, in reading these Sacred Scriptures so long after the

actual events, is that we bring into the text all that we have added due to suggestions and images that we heard and seen. Some questions: Who were the Magi? How many were there? Where did they come from? When did they see the star and get organized? How far did they travel? When did they arrive? Where did they meet Jesus and Mary and Joseph? What was all this with Herod? Why did they disobey him? I thought I would just wet your scriptural whistle with a few comments, but only about a couple of these questions.

#### WHO WERE THE MAGI?

Over the years, they have become "KINGS." There is no evidence of this. Magi describes a category of scholars who engaged in dream interpretation. astrology and predictions of the future. Common opinion is that they came from Persia. We have no idea when they saw the star and what kind of star it was, when they got organized, how long the journey took or where they met Jesus and Mary and Joseph. The scriptural text mentions they came to a "house." Was the house in Bethlehem or Nazareth? Interesting speculation at best. How many were there? Everyone says "three." Why? Because they presented three gifts: gold, frankincense and myrrh. But there could have been more, of course. Legends recorded by an eighth-century saint and first English historian, Bede the Venerable, named the three, Casper, Melchior and Balthasar. Artists, especially after the discovery of the New World, have often made the Magi into a multiracial trio with black, red and yellow faces. Thinking it over, we would be inclined to imagine more than three because a caravan for just three would not be likely. And they could represent more cultures and races than just three.

#### SOME DEEPER MEANINGS AND CHALLENGES

1. The Magi were definitely not Jews but gentiles. This would mean that Jesus, as the Messiah, would be coming for ALL people. The star, always symbolizing "light" would indicate a new and fresh and open way of thinking. Since the Word of God always seeks to challenge us, could this not ask us if we are open to people of all races, religions, ethnic groups? What do we really think about the immigrants, refugees, the poor? What do we think they deserve from us?

2. Herod was the ruling civil authority, a villainous political power. And yet these Magi disobeyed him. They exercised a true form of civil disobedience. They risked their lives for this. Subsequently Joseph and Mary had to take Jesus and flee to Egypt so that Herod would not kill Him. They too became refugees themselves. Do we ever think we have to choose civil disobedience? What about the injustices in our society and in our laws? Do we ever challenge ourselves to consider if have to follow an unjust law or the true laws of God? Where would this lead us? Maybe this will open up some new doors as we, too, follow this "light of Christ."




