TO FELLOW DISCIPLES OF OUR LORD JESUS:

"Love is patient, love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude.

It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hope all things, endures all things. Love never ends." (1 Corinthians 13, 4—8)

I bet you have heard all these already. I certainly hope so. I also hope you have also read this yourself as you read your Bibles. These great words written by St. Paul certainly gives us a lot to think about. I am a great believer that we should post notes on the refrigerator door or our bathroom mirrors. Why? Because we stand before these items more than anything else. So when you go to the refrigerator, you will be reminded of these words. Or when you are putting on your morning face, you can reflect on how to focus your actions and attitudes for the coming day.

First of all, think about selecting one of the ideas about love that you think you should work on the most. Please don't try to do all of them at once. That is much too complicated. Just pick one. Then try to keep that in mind all that day and let it guide your thoughts, attitudes, words and actions. If you look at all of these items, most of them come out of our mouths. Most offences against love come from the words we speak. The letter of St. James says, "Every form of life, four-footed or winged, crawling or swimming, can be tamed, by humankind; the tongue no one can tame. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. We use it to say, 'Praised be the Lord and Father,' then we use it to curse others, though they are made in the likeness of God. Blessing and curse come out of the same mouth." (James 3, 7-10)

Then, secondly, ask someone close to you to tell you which one you should work on. Only do this if you really dare to and really want to know the truth! Then see how close you have come to knowing the truth about yourself and how you act toward others. Maybe this way, we can all come to really "love" more completely and carefully.

The volunteers at Good Samaritan Outreach Center ask for help replenishing the most requested items, including non-perishables such as:


- Pork & Beans


About Good Samaritan Outreach Center (GSOC)


